The correct answers are in bold. Translations of the other phrases appear by them.

1. What does **esperar** mean?

- to wait**
- to sleep (*dormir*)
- to sing (*cantar*)
- to dance (*bailar*)

2. What does **Adiós, amigos** mean?

- Hi, friends. (*Hola, amigos*)
- Good-bye, everybody. (*Adiós a todos.*)
- Good-bye, friends.**
- Who are you people? (*¿Quiénes son ustedes?*)

3. When something is in two languages, we say it's **bilingual**. How do we say that in Spanish?

- bicicleta (*bicycle*)
- baloncesto (*basketball*)
