

It looks like we soon have to say goodbye to the Summer of 2017. Fall will officially be upon us in 3 short weeks on September 22nd. I hope that each of you enjoyed what you could of the summer months, visiting with family and friends. We are ready for the new season here at the Harvest Years!

Our final numbers are in for our State of Delaware Grant-in-Aid. We did in fact receive a 20% cut, but we need to be very thankful that it wasn't the initial 100% cut as it was first proposed. The future is concerning. This 20% cut equals a loss of approximately \$25,000 for our center. Moving forward we do not want to cut services or reduce staff.

I have been looking closely at other costs that can be cut and additional ways to save money for our center. We will have to increase our membership fees, effective January 1st. Your one year renewal for members will now cost \$20.00 per year, per person. As food cost prices continue to rise, we will also be increasing our meal prices. Members cost will increase from \$4.00 to \$4.50 and non-members to \$7.00. This meal price increase will be effective beginning October 1st, 2017.

Our goal is always to continue to provide services to our members to the best of our ability. I ask for your help in the form of volunteering. This will help us eliminate the financial gap we have to work around this year. By doing so we can continue to provide all of the great services we have available to you here at the center.

Remember our motto: "Seniors Helping Seniors"

It's almost time for our *Daily Soup Kitchen* to open. We will begin to offer this as the air gets chilly for the Fall and Winter seasons beginning on Monday, September 11th. You are invited to come in and purchase a cup or a quart to take home and enjoy.

Looking ahead: Our *Annual Giving Campaign* kicks off October 1st, and the *STATE EMPLOYEE'S CHARITA-BLE CAMPAIGN* starts September 1st, 2017. Our code for that is #70082. 

Harvest Years Report – September, 2017 Brian J. Bushweller, State Senator, 17th District

Idea for a September Outing

Now that summer is basically over, the kids are back in school and family trips have given way to more routine activities, September is a great time for Kent County seniors to take advantage of one of Delaware's jewels, Killens Pond State Park. Located just off Route 13, southeast of Felton, Killens Pond could be a refreshing way to spend a great day outdoors, get some really good exercise and enjoy the near perfect weather we get in September. (If you're like me, instead of really great exercise, you could make it really refreshing relaxation ... in a serene and natural setting!)

According to the State Division of Parks and Recreation website, Killens Pond was created as a millpond on the Murderkill River in the late 1700's. The Murderkill area was an ancestral home of several Native American tribes. The website explains that the unusual name of the river stems from a local tribe's massacre of a Dutch trading party in 1648. The site also assures readers that Killens Pond is now "a peaceful oasis".

There's lots to do at Killens Pond. The centerpiece of the Park is the 66 acre millpond that features fishing and boating. The pond is home to largemouth bass, catfish, perch, bluegills and pickerel. "Parks and Rec" says all of these await the patient angler. (In my case, I'm still patiently waiting.) Kayaks and paddle boats are available to rent and the Murderkill River Canoe Trail provides a challenge for more adventurous paddlers. Fishing licenses are required.

The Killens Pond Nature Center sits at the edge of the park's forest with a spectacular view of the Pond from the building's covered deck. The Center includes a collection of native reptiles and amphibians located on the first level.

More recreational activities can be found throughout the woodlands and grassy fields surrounding the Pond. Hiking trails wind through several types of habitat featuring native plants and animals. A Life Course Trail offers a healthy challenge.

The 2.6 mile Pondside Trail is carpeted with pine needles and sand and winds along the banks of the Pond. Playground equipment and picnic areas are the perfect place for pleasant lunch or dinner breaks.

By the way, while you're on that website, take a look at the other parks in Delaware's system. We really do have a fabulous state park system. From the rolling hills and wandering streams of northern Delaware through our wonderful Killens Pond to Trap Pond's magnificent northern most natural stand of bald cypress trees in the United States to our ocean parks, there is beauty to be enjoyed and nature to be embraced.
