A Month in the Eastern Sierras

I hooked up my new Fifth Wheel Trailer on July 28TH at o dark thirty and off I went on a month long vacation to the June Lake loop. I arrived at Silver Lake RV Park around 2:30 PM and set up my site.

I called home to let Gail know I had arrived safely and the first thing she said was did I have the Direct TV hooked up. She was coming up on the last week of my trip and to me the TV was not a priority right then but to her it was. So the next day I tried to get it set up. Had a problem so I called up a local Direct TV installer who moonlighted and she showed up the next day and got it all dialed in. Now it was fishing time for me.

The first three weeks I fished all over the place. I went to Little Virginia Lake twice with my float tube and fly rod. First day I caught three fish around 1.5 lb and the second time I caught seven fish again around 1.5 lb.. I am new at this fly rod fishing so that is why the low count. The guy I went with caught around twenty fish both times. He knew what he was doing. Next year I will do better.

A few day's later we hiked into Walker Lake and the fishing was fantastic. This time I was fishing with bait and caught five fish around 1.6 lb. The hike down and back up was tough but worth it.

I also fished Grant lake from my float tube one day and from shore another day. Did better in the tube. Also fished Lee Vining Creek a couple of times for a limit each day. For a creek the fishing was great. 1.5 to 1.6 lb average.

Next a friend and I rented a boat and fished Gull Lake, we trolled for awhile and the fishing was slow so we anchored up and caught a couple of fish and called it a day.

Also fished Rush Creek a couple of times for a few. Next I put my tube in Silver Lake and had a fantastic time. My biggest was 1.9 lb.

Gail flew into Mammoth Lake Airport on August 19Th and I picked her up. We went to dinner that night at Carson Peak Inn with four of my friends and had a great dinner.

Next day Gail and I took a hike and just enjoyed the sites. The following day we took off for Carson City Nv to visit and old friend of mine, did a little gambling and came back to the RV Park that night.

The following day Gail wanted to do a little fishing so she got a one day fishing license and off we went to Lee Vining Creek, Gail caught a little Brook trout but fishing was slow so we left and went to Rush Creek where she caught three fish the biggest went and even 1 lb. She was happy.

The last day Gail wanted to hike to Agnew Lake above Silver Lake. It is a 2.8 mile hike uphill with an elevation change of over a thousand feet. Going up was though but coming back down was even tougher. We did not take
