Severe Weather Policy

The following Severe Weather Policy for attendance at quarterly TVQA Board meetings is found in the TVQA Policies and Procedures revised May 2024.

The safety of the TVQA guild representatives is of utmost concern. Remember, your safety comes first! The following guidelines apply when the National Weather Service issues a severe weather warning:

If the schools in Rutherford County are closed on the day of the quarterly TVQA board meeting due to weather conditions, or if Rutherford County is under a severe weather warning, there will be no in-person TVQA board meeting. A Zoom meeting will be held and attendance at the zoom meeting will go toward the guilds' incentive. All guild presidents will be contacted, and they should share the information with their guild members.

If Board members' schools outside Rutherford County are closed or their weather is severe, they should use their best judgment in deciding whether to attend in-person or on Zoom. The members should notify one of the Executive Board if this occurs.

If you will not be at the TVQA meeting due to severe weather, contact the TVQA President, Vice President or Secretary either the night before the meeting or before 9:00 a.m. the day of the meeting.

TVQA BOARD MEETING

Minutes of TVQA Board Meeting on November 8, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 10:03am by President Judith Thompson. The Pledge of Allegiance was said, and roll call was completed.

It was moved by Trish Harnen and seconded by Elizabeth Tetlow that the minutes from the August meeting as stated in the newsletter be approved, as were with no objections.

Judith let membership know that the TVQA t-shirts are on pause due to our supplier dealing with some home issues., and anyone waiting on one could request a refund if necessary.

Nominations for the next executive board are open. Nominations will close at the February 2025 meeting, and be voted on then. The new officers will be inducted this July at Assembly Day.

In Judith's President's report, she let everyone know Fall Retreat was a success with over 50 in attendance, with many being MALs. A huge round of thanks was given to chair Trish Harnen for a wonderful event. Judith reported the board is working on creating a private Pinterest board for the members only section of free patterns and craft ideas for reference, as a benefit of being a member. As this progresses, she will report back. The charity project for 2025 will continue to be wheelchair quilts for the VA nursing home. So far TVQA has awarded over 350 quilts to the VA homes, and our contact with the VA will be awarded a Quilt of Valor through Friendship guild.

Vice President Denni Green gave the history of the White Glove show TVQA hosted for years, as well as honoring Hearth and Home and Lincoln County Piecemakers guilds. She asked that if any guild will have changes in their leadership in 2025 to please let her know. She let us know that Quilting Bees lent out their quilt racks for shows, and has the straps to go with them—whoever has them please contact Quilting Bees for said straps. Lastly, our 2024 Mystery Quilt was a huge success and there is plans to do one in 2025. The pattern for this year's is still available until February.

Secretary Lezleigh Kleibrink let all know the board meeting minutes will be available within a week after each quarterly TVQA meeting. The minutes are located in the member section under "Current Board Meeting Minutes". She reported back that TVQA's booth at Sew Expo was a success and hundreds of individuals were spoken to as well as information sheets handed out. In an effort to work with local quilt shops to keep them in business, as well as build relationships with them, she is looking into offering paid advertising in the newsletter as well as social media in 2025. This will enable them to get their info out, as well as TVQA give our information out to them.

Treasurer Sheila Schmaedig reports the current balance is \$12070.43. From here out, all retreats and events will register online, and MALs can register online, as well. They may pay online or via check, they will choose which option when registering. Our \$20 dues are due by February 28th either through your guild, or MALs register online.

At future board meetings, any of the coordinators or representatives should send information for the agenda to me by the Friday before the board meeting. Members with special announcements should also send that information (i.e., Assembly Day, Spring Seminar, etc.)

Membership Coordinator Brenda Willis reminds all to send a list of officers and members to her upon dues renewals by February 28. MALS are being considered a guild with Lezleigh as the liaison and ALL MAL registration will be online.

Newsletter editor Elaine Jackson reminds all that Guild news articles are to be sent to the newsletter editor by the 20th of the month after a board meeting.

Webmaster Chris White was not at the meeting, but Denni let all know that old newsletters from 1986 through October 2012 have been digitized and will be added to the website soon,

Members at Large Liaison Lezleigh Kleibrink let all MALs know that if you are not receiving her emails through the Google group, please let her know. She reminded all that dues renewals will be done solely online with the option to pay online OR by check. She also let all know she is working on a Summer Stitch retreat in conjunction with Stitchers Garden that she will ask MALs to help accomplish.

Assembly Day Chair Carol Tessmer gave details about the 2025 event. It will be hosted by Quilting Bees on July 12th at the Ag Center in Murfreesboro. Anna Maria (Horner)Perry will our guest speaker, but no classes before Assembly Day will be held due to conflicts in schedule. Doors will open at 9am, program will begin at 10am. Registration will begin in March and close June 12th for planning purposes. There will be a limited number as the Ag Center can only hold so many participants. As such, carpooling will be encouraged. Lunch will be box lunches by McAlister's Deli. Guild gift baskets will be done per usual, as well as vendors will be hosted for our shopping pleasure. More information to come as planning continues.

Retreat Coordinator Trish Harnen let all know winter/spring retreat will be held February 26-Mar 2, 2025, at St Mary's. Sign up online will begin November 14th.

The executive board encourages guilds to support our host location's support food box by bringing canned or packaged food to board meetings at Living Faith Ministries. They are very appreciative of any help they can receive. Wheelchair lap quilts will always be welcomed at board meetings.

We encourage all to come visit the Bell Buckle Quilt Walk Dec 5-6 in Bell Buckle, TN. The Quilting Bees, Happy Hands, Material Girls and Friendship Quilters are participating!

Before adjourning at 11:29am, Judith reminded the group we were headed for lunch at Hickory Falls off Sam Ridley Parkway.

Online registration is now open. To register, go to TVQA.org. or click <u>HERE</u>. On the registration form, you will be able to select lodging for each date you wish to attend and the meals you wish to purchase. Prices (before PayPal fees, if applicable) are as follows:

A Featherweight Maintenance class will be offered at this retreat. The cost is \$30.



The Quilting Bees will host TVQA Assembly Day 2025 in Murfreesboro, TN, on July 12, 2025. Planning is still in progress. More information will be available in the April TVQA Newsletter. Here are the facts so far:

- Assembly Day 2025 will be held on July 12, 2025, at the Lane Agri Community Center in Murfreesboro, which is the same location where Quilts in the Boro was held. There will be signage (and possibly balloons) to guide the way to the Center.
- Our speaker will be Anna Maria Parry (Horner). Doors will open at 9 AM, and the program will begin at 10.
- Guilds will be asked to provide gift baskets for the raffle, which will be conducted throughout the day.
- We will not be holding classes in the days prior to this event.
- Online registration will be opened in March with a deadline of June 12.
- There will be a limited number of attendees due to the capacity of the venue. We estimate this to be between 350-400, pending an analysis of capacity. We will have more information in the future, as this may change.
- Lunches will be provided by McAllister's. The current estimate is \$13, which can be ordered during registration.
- We are working on recruiting vendors, and a few have committed to participating.
- Carpooling is encouraged. There are spaces where buses could park, but please let us know if you plan to do this so we can work out the logistics.
- We are still working on our theme and hope to have that finalized soon.



Our philanthropic efforts for 2024 yielded 66 quilts donated to the Downs Syndrome Association of Middle Tennessee, 210 quilts and 135 knitted hats donated to various Neonatal Intensive Care Units in the vicinity, and 7 quilts donated to Brooks House which is a women's only shelter in Lebanon for abused and homeless women and their children.

Our Quilts of Valor chapter produced 35 quilts for the year. Our members are proud of all the Guild has accomplished in 2024 and look forward to an even more productive 2025.






