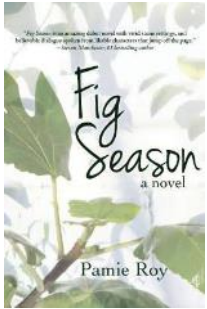
Bookworms for 1st & 2nd Graders
