

This year's Youth Explosion was indeed an awesome representation of how God is using and blessing our young people. We thank God for the energy and power with which our young people led us into worship and praise!



# CHILDREN & YOUTH MINISTRIES' HIGHLIGHTS DURING THE 123RD ANNUAL SESSION AND CONGRESS OF CHRISTIAN FAITH FORMATION



During the 123rd Annual Session and Congress of Christian Faith Formation, the children and youth explored the theme: "Loving Who I Am! Learning Who I Want to Be!" Each day, they were actively engaged in Bible-based, character-building lessons and activities related to the theme which were prepared and delivered by the Youth Ministry Advisory Team (YMAT). The following topics were covered: "What is Love?"; "Know Who You Are - You Are Enough!"; "Jesus Loves Me and I Love Myself & Others"; "I Am: Affirmations"; "The 5C Network - Christ-centeredness, Character, Confidence, Courage, & Compassion"; "I Am: Growing, Learning, Becoming!". There was also a presentation on "Weatherization and Energy Efficiency" for the young people to watch, participate in, and be inspired by. This presentation challenged them to make a difference in their communities through community service to others.



Time was spent doing Arts & Crafts where the children and youth made greeting cards, bookmarks, a heart gift box, and colored pictures related to Bible stories. During the ministry-focused activities, they learned praise dancing; explored the topic - "Seeing God Through Nature"; wrote a Prayer of Thanks and "My Now" and "My Later" letters to themselves. There was also time set aside to play games such as Jeopardy, Hop-Scotch, Code Name, Word Search, and have fun! On Wednesday, the children, youth, youth workers and YMAT took a field trip and explored the past achievements of some famous African Americans. We visited the home of Maggie L. Walker; the statue of Bill "Bojangles" Robinson; and the historic & beautiful Ebenezer Baptist Church. It was truly inspiring!







In conclusion, the Children and Youth Ministries sessions at the 123rd Annual Session and Congress of Christian Faith Formation were truly blessed and inspirational. They were filled with lessons and activities where the children and youth spent time talking and learning about God, themselves, their world, and others; enjoyed opportunities to fellowship, laugh, play, have fun and make new friends; and reflected on who they are in the eyes of God and what they can become through His love and power.

## WHAT THE CHURCH DID T **SHAPE ME!**

was destined to be a part of the ministry. My grandfather, the late Reverend Doctor Clifton Whitaker, Jr., was the pastor of Grayland Baptist Church, the church I grew up in, and where my family was deeply interwoven into the fabric of the congregation. My mother and aunts sang in the choir and were deaconesses, and my father was a deacon, too. It was only natural that I explored the full array of activities that the church had to offer, many of which catered to the youth. From the traditional baptism to gatherings, the church did many things that shaped me into who I am today, but with any positive influence, it had its setbacks as well.



Baptism, one of the cornerstones of the Baptist faith, was introduced to me at a very young age. The act was one of giving yourself fully to Christ, and although it took most people many years of contemplation to commit, I knew early on that I wanted to do so. Fully supportive, my family and church were eager to help me on my journey to become baptized, and a few weeks later, I was. I still remember the admittedly nasty taste of communion, but I knew that this was something I would never regret. And now, I can soundly say that this was one of the first major steps that defined who I am.

After that, I became invested in Sunday School. This specialized service, catered to youths, was certainly more engaging than regular services, and for that I was grateful. I was notorious for falling asleep in church, but Sunday School kept me awake with the interaction that was had between the teacher, students, and the Bible. This service fostered a love for learning that I can attribute to my academic success, and I don't know where I'd be without it.

I was a shy little girl, still am to an extent, yet get-togethers were always a fun time. From dinners to movie nights to block parties, it was an excellent time to socialize. We came together to celebrate but also to worship, and I must say that it formed key memories for me. The food was a nice bonus, too. Additionally, there was Vacation Bible School, a program for the summer, broken down into age groups, that provided age-appropriate biblical education. It was the highlight of my summer. As I got older, I even helped with the activities as a volunteer. Overall, I'd say that social skills were refined by these events and getting community service hours helped my school prospects as well.

As great as my experience within the church was, undoubtedly there were some aspects that could have been improved. Most notably, the outreach for youth was lacking. That isn't to say that there wasn't any but getting young people to stick around was a challenge. As the years went by, the numbers of children in the congregation dwindled, and there was little that could be done about it. That leads me to my next point which is to encourage parents to bring their kids. The children sure aren't driving themselves to church, and without leading by example, the youth will be lost. So, what can be done? Increasing the regularity of youth-oriented programs is a start. Throwing together an event once every blue moon isn't going to draw the masses but forming habits will. How can you expect anyone to keep coming back if what drew them in isn't a regular occurrence? It's basic logic. Another is to really sell the idea of coming to Sunday School to the youth. Most kids think that church is boring, but it's actually how the message is conveyed that determines how well it is received. For example, we, the youth, can become the voice of the church. As we read the scripture, we can make our own sermons and influence the adults of the congregation. This will make the youth active in Christ and lay the foundations for lifelong attendance.

Now you may be reading this wondering where I'm drawing inspiration from, and that would be Second Baptist Church Southside. Pastored by Reverend Ralph Hodge, the

church has many programs meant to shape the youth, and it is paying off. There is Sunday School, as is common, but they also have boy/girl scouts affiliated with the church. This intersection between community service and gospel gives the kids something to do that's fun and keeps them in the



house of the Lord. Second Baptist also has age divided groups such as Kids for Christ and the Young Adults Ministry (YAM) that includes the youth in planning for themselves on how to make things interesting around the church. And if none of that suits their palates, there is the community garden that you can volunteer for to upkeep. Notice how all these activities engage and maintain attention consistently. This is what we need to make the youth ministry alive, to help our youth to survive, and to assist the church so it may thrive.

Reflecting on my experiences, the church shaped me into who I am in these ways, and I'm sure that with a few improvements here and there, more can reap the benefits and blessings that I gained. And as an a Hermitage High School honors recipient, 6th in my class ranking, enrolled student at Old Dominion University, I know that the church helped me on my journey.
