CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES FOR 6-19-2024

Members Present: Abigail Anderson, Kay Campe, Marilyn Forstrom, Christina Hainy, Sue Kruse, Larry Lasch, and Marcia Musser. Ex-officio members present: Pastor Cory and Dara Bliesmer, Asst Treasurer. Members Absent: Amber Brummond, Catherine Johnson, Jane Kotewa, Abby Shoen and Tara Thedens.

The Council met in Heritage Hall at 5:45 PM. Moderator Kay Campe called the meeting to order, and Pastor Cory led in prayer. We celebrated generosity in the church, naming several recent events for which we are thankful.

Motion to approve the minutes from the meeting on May 15, 2024, was M/S/C. (Abigail Anderson/Marcia Musser)

Treasurer's Report Dara Bliesmer reported about moving some of our money market cash into a CD on a quarterly basis. At the end of May, we received 38% of pledged giving, which is slightly down. Pledged giving has decreased from the beginning of the year. A motion to receive the treasurer's report was M/S/C. (Abigail Anderson/Marilyn Forstrom)

Pastor's Report: Pastor Cory has officiated a wedding and a funeral, marched in two local parades, made several home visits to Mankato, had a few reflective pastoral supervision Zooms and did the invocation for the Relay for Life Survivor Supper in the last month.

Mission Minute:

July Blessing Box: Heaven's Table Backpack program.

Starting in late September, brown bags will be placed in participating kids' backpacks on Fridays for them to take home for the weekend. The contents include 2 items for breakfast, 2 dinner/meat items, 2 beverages, and 4 snacks. This past school year 326 kids across Martin County participated and 11,408 bags were sent home. The average cost per bag is \$3. The program serves K-6 public school kids at Martin County West, Truman, Granada-Huntley-East Chain, and Fairmont Schools. Heaven's Table Food Shelf runs the program, using separate financing other than the food shelf.



Notes from the Church Treasurer

Early summer 2024

Thanks be to God, and to the active givers of our church, that our church is in pretty good financial shape. As of the end of May, we have received 38% of the budgeted offerings. Thanks to each of you for your faithful gifts!! Our spending continues to be very close to what we budgeted, though utilities are above budget. We need to continue to remember that we will need to increase our giving and fundraising to meet the budget.

Thanks to all of you who participated in so many ways in the Breakfast on the Lawn and Pie Social Fundraisers. Breakfast on the Lawn raised \$362 and the Pie Social raised \$1776.

The carpet project is completed. At the time of the carpet installation, the front of the sanctuary was rearranged. Thanks to everyone who contributed to the gorgeous new piano and to the future upkeep of the organ.

The next major project is replacing the aging, squeaking furnace/ air conditioner that is part of the climate control for our sanctuary. It has functioned for a year or more beyond its predicted life span. Facilities and the Church Council have decided it is more cost effective to plan to replace it this summer rather than wait for it to fail at some inconvenient time. The cost will be approximately \$10,000. If you feel called to contribute, please label your gift as for the furnace.

Our Blessing Box ministries are supported by going above and beyond our general giving for church support. As of the end of April, \$5,302 has been contributed for both local and wider church missions.

Summer is a busy time. Continuing to support our General Fund is a very important part of continuing our churches ministries. If you are not going to be able to be in church regularly, remember you can arrange with your bank to send a check or you can mail your pledged and other giving to the church office.

This sweet dessert for July makes use of abundant summer zucchini crops!

Zucchini Chocolate Cake

Ingredients:

1/2 cup milk

1 to 1 1/2 tsp. vinegar or lemon juice

1/2 cup butter, softened

1/2 cup vegetable oil

1 1/2 cups sugar

2 large eggs

2 tsp. vanilla

2 1/2 cups flour

1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. cinnamon

1/2 tsp. cloves

l tsp. baking soda

1/2 tsp. baking powder

2 cups grated zucchini, blotted with paper towel

1/2 to 1 cup chocolate chips (can also add 1/2 cup chopped nuts)

Directions:

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. Grease & flour a 9×13 " pan.

Combine milk and vinegar (or lemon juice) in a bowl. Let milk stand to sour, about 5 minutes.

Cream butter, oil and sugar. Add eggs, vanilla, sour milk; beat together. Add dry ingredients; stir until just combined. Fold in zucchini. Pour into pan. Sprinkle with chocolate chips. (and chopped nuts if using).

Bake for 45 to 50 minutes until toothpick inserted into center comes out clean. Cool on a wire rack.
