# KIRKLEES LOCAL PLAN

Cheryl Tyler said that the inspection was continuing. The Inspector Katie Child had raised numerous issues after Stage 1 ended in October. Stage 2 relating to Minerals, Waste Policies and Allocations was postponed to this month because the Inspector Elizabeth Hill had a bereavement. Stage 3 which was Policies on part 1 of the Plan has taken place. The final one due to start next month is site specific and is in two parts. The Huddersfield area will be examined first, then Dewsbury & Mirfield. Cheryl will attend that hearing with the experts employed by Save Mirfield. However she will also attend on 20th February when safeguarded land issues will be discussed for Huddersfield so that she can be forewarned. She said that it was likely to be very busy and discussion will be restricted, so it has been important to ensure that the Hearing Statements are fully detailed. Save Mirfield is using a Planning Lawyer to collate all the information submitted by the Highways & Planning Consultants.

## STRATEGIC ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

Phil Tolson asked why we couldn't use one already submitted for the Local Plan. Cheryl Tyler said that the Local Plan Inspector had commented that there weren't enough Environmental Assessments.

#### **AOB**

Martyn Bolt commented that whilst it was important to maintain numbers in the Group, it could prove disadvantageous to take on new members who might want to go back on old ground. Christine Sykes said that experts could be invited as required and mentioned that she had been speaking to Eric Brown the Oakwell Hall Head Ranger who was a regular attendee during the Mirfield Design Statement meetings when he was a Ranger for the Kirklees Countryside Unit.

Viv Lees-Hamilton told the group that Kirklees had again employed Rangers who could be called upon to resolve issues like fly tipping. Referrals could be made to her, and she would forward them accordingly.
