## STRATTON TRANSFER STATION

<i>Location:</i> <b>8 Town Garage Rd, Stratton, VT 05360</b> <a href="#">Click here for Google Map of facility location</a>	<i>Hours:</i> <b>Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday 9 am - 5 pm</b>	<i>Contract Hauler:</i> <b>Casella</b>
<i>Access:</i> <b>Open to residents, property owners &amp; their trash haulers. Passes must be obtained (free of charge) at the Town Clerk's office. Punch tickets can be purchased for \$35 at Stratton Town office or \$40 at the Transfer Station. Users without passes will pay double the disposal fees, and can pay at the transfer station with check or cash.</b>		



## TRASH

<b>Trash</b>	<i>Cost:</i> <b>up to 16 gallons = \$1 16-gal to 32-gal = \$2; larger bags (55 gallon) = \$4</b>	<i>Hauler:</i> <b>Casella</b>
<b>Furniture / Construction Debris</b>	<i>Cost:</i> <b>\$30 per cubic yard; Mattresses \$10</b>	<i>Hauler:</i> <b>Casella</b>



## RECYCLING – Single Stream

<b>Single Stream Recyclables</b> <i>Goes in the covered dumpsters</i>	<i>Cost:</i> <b>No charge</b>	<i>Hauler:</i> <b>Casella</b>
<i>Materials Accepted:</i> <b>Cardboard:</b> shipping boxes, cereal boxes, egg cartons, paper towel and toilet paper rolls <b>Paper:</b> office paper, newspaper, paper bags, magazines, junk mail <b>Plastic Bottles, Jugs, Tubs, &amp; Lids:</b> drink bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, shampoo bottles, etc. <b>Metal Cans:</b> soda and beer cans, soup and vegetable cans, foil (clean and balled up) <b>Glass Bottles &amp; Jars:</b> beer bottles, other beverage bottles, pickle jars		<i>Exclusions:</i> No plastic bags, No Styrofoam, No plant pots or flats, No toys, No 5-gallon buckets, No scrap metal, No rope or hose
<i>Where it goes:</i> Triple T collects the recyclables and takes them to the Materials Recycling Facility (MRF) in Rutland, run by Casella Waste Systems. There the materials are separated by mechanical means and human hands. The separated materials are then compacted into bales weighing up to 1,300 lb. The bales are trucked to manufacturers who use them as a source material. Less than 10% of material that enters the MRF ends up being thrown away; when it does, it is usually because they are not recyclable items to begin with, or have been contaminated by food or dirt. <a href="#">Click here for tips on how to recycle better</a>		



## FOOD SCRAPS

<b>Food Scraps and Soiled Paper</b>	<i>Cost:</i> <b>No charge</b>	<i>Hauler:</i> <b>Casella</b>
<i>Materials Accepted:</i> <b>Kitchen scraps:</b> bread, pasta, beans, egg shells, cheese, veggies, etc. <b>Meats:</b> cooked or raw, fish and shellfish (including bones) <b>Other stuff:</b> coffee grounds and filters, cooking oils & fats, garden weeds <b>Soiled Paper:</b> greasy pizza boxes, milk/juice cartons, used tissues, paper towels, paper plates and cups, waxed paper, egg cartons, frozen food containers		<i>Exclusions:</i> No plastics, foil, trash, metal, glass, or Styrofoam
<i>Where it goes:</i> Casella collects the food scraps and takes them to their Long Trail Composting Facility in Bennington.		



## SPECIAL ITEMS

<b>Scrap Metal</b>	<i>Cost:</i> <b>No charge</b>		<i>Hauler:</i> <b>George Apkins &amp; Sons</b>
	<i>Materials Accepted:</i> <b>Anything mostly made of metal:</b> gas grills, wheel rims, metal chairs, metal shelving, etc.		<i>Exclusions:</i> No fuel tanks, No pressurized tanks
	<i>Where it goes:</i> The metal goes to a scrap yard that shreds it into fist-sized pieces, sorts it, and sends the metals to foundries or other manufacturers. The “fluff” non-metal is disposed of as trash.		
<b>Appliances</b>	<i>Cost:</i> <b>Large= \$10, Small= \$6</b>	<i>Material accepted:</i> Non-electrical appliances only, No commercial equipment	<i>Hauler:</i> <b>George Apkins &amp; Sons</b>
<b>Tires</b>	<i>Cost:</i> <b>up to 16.5" = \$2 off rim/\$4 on rim</b> <b>16.5 &amp; up = \$4 off rim/\$8 on rim</b>	<i>Materials Accepted:</i> Passenger tires, bicycle and motorcycle tires. NO TRACTOR/LOADER TIRES	<i>Hauler:</i> <b>Bob's Tire</b>
	<i>Where it goes:</i> End uses through Bob's Tires: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 25% used as TDF (tire-derived fuel) in paper mills in Maine</li> <li>• 25% used as TDA (tire-derived aggregate) in roads and other applications</li> <li>• 25% reused as tires or recaps</li> <li>• 25% reused as dock bumpers; fishing gear – lobster pot strips to protect traps &amp; on chains and drags in scalloping; playgrounds</li> </ul>		
<b>Clothing</b>	<i>Cost:</i> <b>No charge</b>	<i>Materials Accepted:</i> Clothing and textiles: clean and dry; in tied and sturdy plastic bags

<i>Stratton is a member of the Windham Solid Waste Management District which gives residents access to the WSWMD transfer station and services. (The District also provides planning services to the town including the regional <a href="#">Solid Waste Implementation Plan.</a>)</i>			
<b>Location:</b> 327 Old Ferry Rd, Brattleboro		<b>Hours:</b> 7-3 weekdays; 8-1 Saturday	
<b>Access:</b> Open to residents and businesses of any WSWMD member town. Annual access permit is \$40 and runs from July 1 to June 30 each year. Stickers go on sale May 1 each year. A \$15 day-pass is also available.
