We discussed this and other ways, such as bringing back the "bragging table" or having a 10-minute time just before the break of approximately 3 members doing a show and tell, then people can come look and ask questions during the break. 2025 SILENT AUCTION RULES

Half Hour Auctions:

• White slips only. Please print the material, your name, and check box if item is a Donation or Consignment. If unchecked it will be automatically considered a donation. Put your opening bid on first line and leave name blank for first bidder.

2 Hour Auctions:

• There will be 3 two hour auctions each day (hour and a half on last one on Sunday) for higher value items, and a limit of two items per family, per auction for each session unless there is a shortage of material for the table. The bid sheets for this auction are on colored slips. Please print your name clearly on the slip as well as what the item is. Fill in the beginning bid price and leave the name area blank next to it. The 2 hour colored sheets have a BUY IT NOW price as well as the opening bid below it. **BUY IT NOW** seems to sell better if that price runs about \$10 to \$15 above opening **BID** amount.

- Bid slips will be available at the April meeting so club members can prepare their items for sale.
- Each sheet should be attached to its item with a rubber band.
- A 4% cover charge will be added to the buyer's total to cover card user charges.
- The first of the day will begin at 10:45 am, so as not to interfere with the calling of door prizes.
- NO BIDDING while working behind the tables and NO socializing with non-workers behind the tables.
- All items must be paid for at the end of the auction round & there will be no storing of materials for club members behind the tables.
- Only volunteers that are pre-signed up are allowed behind the tables unless someone is filling in for a no-show.
- The chairs behind the tables are for the auction-workers use only.
- If an item does not sell, it will be removed from the table and set aside for another sale round or set aside for the owner to claim later.

• The payout on sales is 70% to owner, 30% to club. If you want a certain amount for your item, please figure out that amount in your 70% return and write that on your slip as the opening bid.

At our January meeting, the juniors brainstormed different crafts they could make with some of the tiny tumbled stones and slabs that have been provided to the club. Then at the February meeting, we brought out the rocks and some glue and they got very creative! They experimented with different colors and shapes, creating a small medallion to keep for themselves, and they also decorated some treasure boxes and photo holders to sell at the show.

Rhombohedral Calcite by Devan

From as clear as an opal to opaque as a rock, calcite stands out. My sample is rhombohedral, translucent, whitish in color, and has a hardness of three on the Mohs scale.

It is made of calcium carbonate. It is made when calcium dissolved from calcium-rich water. Calcite is formed everywhere so it is pretty common. It is also used in many ways, such as building materials, pigment, pharmaceuticals, and more!

Fun fact: the largest crystal of calcite ever found was 23 feet by 23 feet by 6.6 feet, or 7 m by 7 m by 2 m.

Colemanite by Claire, age 8

Colemanite is a hydrated calcium borate mineral that is a primary source of borax and boric acid, chemical formula Ca2B6O11·5H2O.

Its color can be milky gray, tan, yellow, or amber orange. Brighter colors are rare and valuable.

Colemanite is found in many places like United State, Canada, Mexico, Argentina, Kazakstan, Serbia, Greece, and Turkey.
