FUN FACT! A look at Rockford's past...

Ordinance 100 was passed by the Town Council on September 15, 1913.

It is the first town ordinance establishing speed limits for motorized vehicles within the town limits. Driving over any crosswalk or crossing, and through intersections the speed was limited to no faster than "one mile in 15 minutes" (4mph). At any other place within the town limits no faster than "one mile in 5 minutes." The ordinance also required motor vehicles on the streets during the hours of darkness to have at least one lighted lamp (white to front, red to the rear). The fine for violating: at least \$1 but not more than \$25.
