



For our July newsletter, I thought it would be interesting to explore where the idea of volunteering began.

The history of volunteering began in America during the 1700's.

Early accounts of volunteerism in America started along with the urban centers that developed in the colonies. The first volunteer firehouse was started in Philadelphia by Benjamin Franklin in 1736. During this time, volunteerism was rooted in bettering the community and faith-based charity work.

The Revolutionary War was the first major volunteer recruitment effort in our nation's history. As the country recruited soldiers to join the army, everyday civilians also banded together to raise funds and boycott British goods.

Throughout the country, volunteerism expanded beyond faith and the church and into patriotism. Volunteering was a way for ordinary people to demonstrate love for their country and support war efforts.

In today's world volunteers are needed more than ever. What is a volunteer? Several dictionaries say "It is an individual or group who offer their time and service free of charge for the betterment of something"

Throughout the Methodist church volunteers are a vital part of many of the missions and ministries. Without volunteers a lot of things the organization does would not occur. Throughout this newsletter we will explore some of the Global ministries along with state and our own local opportunities.



The Board of Global Ministries and UMCOR...

Both of these organizations are part of the Methodist church . Global Ministries connects the church in



mission by equipping and transforming people and places for God's mission around the world in over 80 countries.

"As biblically rooted and historically informed organizations, Global Ministries facilitates engagement in God's mission. As part of the Global Ministries, the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is a nonprofit group dedicated to alleviating human suffering around the globe."

UMCOR focuses on disasters that overwhelm a local community's ability to respond, such as storms and flooding, fires, volcanoes, war and civil unrest.

Partners working with UMCOR select beneficiaries based on need and vulnerability as opposed to any other category (such as gender, race or religion).

Local churches assists UMCOR by donating Conference Kits like school kits, cleaning buckets, health kits, etc. These kits are sent throughout the world. Donations are also accepted. Volunteers travel far and wide to assist with these ministries.

Aldersgate United Methodist Church Music Department Did You Know ...?

Your VOICE is an INSTRUMENT.

After awakening from a nap or a long night's rest, have you ever considered why your voice sounds scratchy or "froggy" when you talk? Have you noticed that the tenor (sound) of your voice is usually lower at the start of your day than it is after you have been talking for a while? WHY? Your vocal cords need to be "warmed up" and, *possibly*, "tuned" BEFORE you sing or give a long talk (a lecture, a speech, or a sermon). Consider doing these warm-up exercises to "cheer up, prepare, and protect" your vocal cords safely. You might have fewer sore throats!

Say aloud and enunciate: "Distinct diction, meaningful movements, and enthusiastic engagement with my audience might prove to charismatically captivating." (REPEAT the phrase 5 times and increase the speed as you do.)

SPEAK CLEARLY these silly phrases in 7 seconds or less: "Momma Mia, Poppa Pia, Tommy Tia, Comma Coma, Womba Whalah, Betty Beepie, and Umu HuLu"

SING your ABCs softly 3 times:

"ABCDEFGHIJKLMNOPQRSTUVWXYZ." **SING the alphabet BACKWARDS:** "ZYXWVUTSRQPONMLKJIHGFEDCBA" (same

melody).

LAUGHTER will warm your vocal cords, too. So...LAUGH FREELY at corny jokes!
