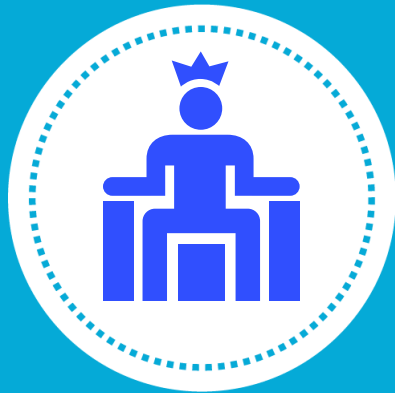


Jesus Christ

The ancient Israelites had a number of ideas concerning the messiah, that are completely separate from each other. More specifically, these ideas concern the messiah, the suffering servant and the son of man. Jesus Christ made it clear, that he fulfills all three of these roles. Any study of christology, (the study of the doctrine of Christ) must examine all three of these.



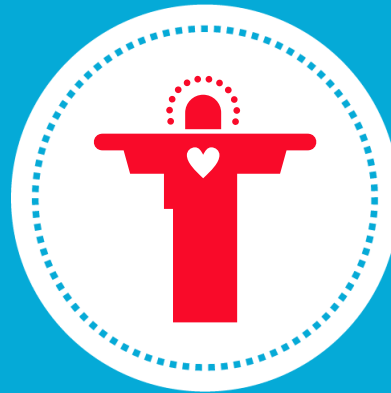
The Messiah

The "annointed one" is the ideal human leader of the coming kingdom.



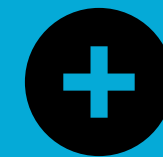
The Suffering Servant
Isaiah 63
