### From Pastor Bill's Study

Greetings to all,

On Sunday we had the pleasure to welcome three people into membership here at Bethany. This does help us to live into what it means to be a church, a body of believers dedicated to Christ and helping others to believe in Christ as well. In Matthew 28 it is summed up as go and make disciples.

### Leadership Team (Ad Board) Report....

The devotions that began the February 19 Leadership Team meeting focused on the lessons of James 2:17 and Romans 12:9-17, and were followed by a discussion on "listening up and leading with your ears", based on the second chapter of the Farr-Kotan book entitled "The Necessary Nine." Points to consider: Are we listening to what's going on around us? What is the context of our church? We have to concentrate on building up leaders and disciples. We need to define our mission area and discern people's needs. We should remove labels in describing church services to folks. And we have to listen to the right people in our community, take time to work on the needs we discover, and make clear what we stand for.

Our latest internal financial reports and the recent updates on the standings of the holdings we gave with our two investment firms continue to reflect the stability and good health of all our accounts.

In terms of gifting, we have agreed to stay with donating to each individual; UMC Special Sunday as it comes along during the year instead of trying to combine them into groups.

We're still looking for a part-time custodian to take care of cleaning the church and the Parish House. Currently, we have two leads and are in the process of pursuing both.

On January 19, Pastor Bill, Janet and I traveled to Williamsport to take advantage of an opportunity to engage in discussions with some of the Susquehanna Conference delegates who have been elected to participate in the February 2019 meeting on the "Way Forward" at the special convention of the United Methodist denomination's General Conference in St. Louis. The Williamsport gathering was held for the purpose of giving central Pennsylvania church leaders a chance to confirm the expectations of the delegation in terms of the direction of the larger conclave, to ask questions of them, to offer them last-minute input, and to encourage them and pray with them for the success of their mission.

My personally-chosen on-line course on Spiritual Formation began on January 21 and is now in Week 5 of a scheduled 6. This is the first of four planned calendar 2019 courses on that subject. The successful completion of all of them will result in my certification in that field of ministry and stands to be of benefit to the spiritual life and direction of Bethany. 
### Lenten Offering....


