As the flowers are homegrown they are super fresh, have a fabulous, consistent high quality and are a world apart from the usual supermarket offerings. They pick

their flowers daily and condition them overnight, they don't spend days in crates or flying half way across the world and they aren't laced with pesticides, dyes and preservatives so they are better for you and the planet.

Barnsley Opals WI were honoured to welcome the Mayor of Barnsley and members of the Royal British Legion to The Glass Works for the unveiling of our stunning 14-metre cascade of over 3,000 hand-crafted poppies.

This incredible display has been lovingly created by members of BOWI along with their friends, families, and local community groups - a true symbol of remembrance, creativity, and community

spirit.

The Cascade made the BBC News website, local radio and became an internet sensation on all the local social media forums. A fabulous testament to the WI's commitment to the annual

Remembrance Commemorations.

Sarah Dunn, of the institute's committee, said Remembrance was an important time and they wanted something for the wider community to have as a "mark of respect for our fallen soldiers and all those who have served".

The poppies were originally displayed in 2024 at St Mary's Church to commemorate Remembrance Day. This year an extra 1,000 flowers have been added

to the cascade.
