Purpose:

To establish and maintain, in accordance with N.F.P.A. 1500, Paragraph 2-6.1 and all appropriate O.S.H.A. regulations, an accurate record for personnel that have been exposed to contagious diseases, bloodborne pathogens, or hazardous substances as part of their job activities.

Application:

This policy applies to incident exposures to hazardous substances, contagious diseases, bloodborne pathogens, and other potentially infectious materials that may result in infection or subsequent illness of Cumberland Road Fire Department Personnel.

Procedure:

All personnel shall notify his/her supervisor of any exposure to, as part of his/her job activity, a hazardous substance, contagious disease, bloodborne pathogen, or other potentially infectious material that may result in infection or subsequent illness.

All personnel are responsible for completing a Cumberland Road Fire Department Incident Exposure Report on each exposure to, as part of his/her job activity, a hazardous substance, contagious disease, bloodborne pathogen, or other potentially infectious material that may result in infection or subsequent illness.

Supervisor shall ensure that all Incident Exposure Reports are complete on the date of occurrence.

Supervisor shall forward all Incident Exposure Reports to the Assistant Fire Chief.

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The Fire Department Shall maintain all personal Incident Exposure reports for at least the duration of membership/employment plus 30 years in accordance with 39 C.F.R. 1910.20 and N.F.P.A. 1500 2-6.1- 2-6.3.
