Minutes - Board Meeting, May 15, 2023

Present: Officers – Patrick Donohue, Caroline Bowdish, Patty DeForest, Larry Hulstrom, Peter Kovich, Wayne Larson, Sally Lyon, Pauline Schafer, Chris Sorensen, Debbie Muller.

Meeting called to order at 6:36 p.m.

Old Business

Treasurer's report: Not published per historic club practices.

Church had inquired if we would consider changing the day of the week for our meeting – possibly Tuesday or Thursday. Larry informed them the membership had not shown a preference for either day, but were willing to consider the change. Church has not made a decision yet.

Show Business

- Larry declared the Show is over. He has some signs and stuff to put away. Receipts and invoices being finalized and paid.
- Larry has had several discussions with Fairgrounds and Camping people:
 - Talking about revamping parking and possibly building another building.
 - Most things will be different next year: if we want to have building 3 in addition to building 2, we will probably be charged; cost for building 2 will probably increase.
 - We DO have our dates locked in: April 20-21, 2024.
 - When negotiations begin, Larry would like a couple of people to go with him as additional ears and support.
- Requests/considerations for next year:
 - Would like to have a vendor that sells supplies; possibly Irv's Lapidary from Spokane?
 - 3-4 vendors backed out late this year, so the cancellation policy has been revamped.
 - Larry would like input on vendors to keep and/or NOT invite to return.
 - Space around the Silent Auction area should be cordoned off to avoid people getting back behind the space.
 - Discussion about taking credit cards for entry fees/tickets: credit card transactions are costly to the club; possible to have an ATM brought in? Potential suppliers could be credit unions, banks, or possibly the Fairground has one?
 - Fairgrounds people were talking about us raising our cost of entry and giving them \$1 per ticket sale, as well as the
 possibility of selling tickets electronically. Larry informed them we have our own tickets and weren't planning to
 raise our ticket price.
 - How were the bumper sticker sales? Sold most, but not all. Was price too high?

New Business

- Chris has arranged a guest speaker for the October 4th meeting; Bob Carson, Professor Emeritus at Whitman College. She requests an update when church makes decision about our meeting day change, so she may inform Mr. Carson ASAP.
- Discussion around confusion on the membership form regarding the pro-rated amounts. Decided to amend the form with "For new members only..." in an attempt to show that renewing members don't receive that prorated amount in subsequent years of membership. Additional discussion concerned the possibility of changing the pro-rated amount/time frame to once per year (say, June), rather than 4 times per year. Decision was to try the "For new members only" first.
- This change to the membership form brought further items to be changed: Juniors ages changed to read from age 8 to 16; include \$10.00 cost for paper Geode starting Nov. 2023 issue and, on brochure change Reach information, meeting day/time (when/if changes).
- Ron Northey donated 5# tumbled rock. Discussion of potential key chain party.
- June meeting Tailgating from 6 to 7 p.m.
- Meeting from 7 to 8 p.m.

Junior Club Business

- Pauline reported 11 new members, with 2-4 returning members. Intended to fill Reach display case with items brought by returning members, but needed to fill in on their behalf. Next month Tate and Juni will fill display with the Minecraft exhibit from the Show.
- Chris spoke with the Hermiston Junior Club while attending the Hermiston show and they indicated an interest in joint meetings/activities with our Junior Club. Since they have pre-planned their entire year, there may be some switching around to be done also considering possibly getting together on a Sunday, rather than midweek.
