Reminder: Store front or Home Business Licenses and Animal Licenses need to be purchased or renewed for 2018 !

Home based business located in Residential areas (Zone 1) need to follow the "Discretionary Use" By-Law #450.

The Municipal Planning Commission is made up of 3 members of Council and they make the final decision when considering any applications.

Discretionary Use: mans a use of land or a building that may be compatible with other uses in the District and for which a development permit **may be issued** upon an application having been made.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION AND PRIVACY ACT (FOIP)

DID YOU KNOW?

In "K" Division RCMP Jurisdiction between April 1, 2016 and March 31, 2017:

- There was a vehicle reported stolen **every 55 minutes**.
- There was a theft/attempted theft from a motor vehicle reported **every 41 minutes**.

IN ALMOST HALF OF THE THEFT OF MOTOR VEHICLE FILES, KEYS WERE LEFT IN UNLOCKED VEHICLES.
