"The Poles and the Defense of Freedom"

"General Kosciuszko... is as pure a son of liberty as I have ever known, and of that liberty which is to go to all, and not to the few or rich alone." Thomas Jefferson

The Poles have made significant, largely unnoticed, contributions to American and Christian freedom. On September 11 (9/11), 1683, King Jan III Sobieski of Poland led a coalition of Christian forces, including 30,000 Polish troops, in defeating the Ottoman army in their siege of Vienna. The Battle of Vienna resulted in the halt to the expansion of the Muslims into Europe and marked the beginning of the Ottoman Empire's decline.

In August of 1920 Marshal Jozef Pilsudski led Polish forces at the Vistula River in the Battle of Warsaw against the Russian Communists. The Polish victory resulted in the stop of the spread of Communism further into Europe, at least for a time.

In 1776 Thaddeus Kosciuszko showed up in Philadelphia armed with training from a military academy in Warsaw and a civil engineering education in Paris. He desired to enlist in the Continental Army to fight for the cause of freedom. John Hancock appointed him to be a colonel, and Kosciuszko set to work on establishing the defenses of several American forts.

Perhaps his greatest contribution came at the Battle of Saratoga. British General Burgoyne was unable to penetrate the defenses which Kosciuszko set up and suffered significant casualties. General Gates and Benedict Arnold finished off the British army. The American victory is credited with convincing the French to enter the war on the side of the Colonists. General Gates later wrote, "The great tacticians of the campaign were hills and forests which a young Polish Engineer was skillful enough to select for my encampment."

In modern times Poland gained its freedom from the USSR in 1989. Lech Welesa and comrades in the Gdansk shipyards were credited with successfully resisting the Communist government. As in most Western democracies there has been a struggle going on in Poland in recent years between secular and humanist values on the one hand and values more aligned with Christian principles on the other hand. A few weeks ago elections were held in Poland for the office of president.

Rafal Trzaskowski is the mayor of Warsaw. He is favorable toward the EU and other European organizations. He has favored same-sex marriage and laws promoting abortion. He has received support from American George Soros.

Karol Nawrocki is a historian who did his Ph.D. dissertation on the dangers of Communism. He campaigned on a platform of Polish patriotism, Christian values, and distrust of international organizations exercising authority beyond national borders. In February 2024 Russia announced that it was filing criminal charges against him for the removal of monuments commemorating the presence of the Red Army on Polish territory in the years 1944–1989. Nawrocki won the election with 50.89% of the vote and will take office in August. May the gospel and freedom continue to flourish in Poland.
