Warrant

For annual Plantation Meeting for year 1942. To Fred L. Townsend, Constable of the Plantation of Monhegan in Lincoln County, Meeting:

In the name of the state of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of said Plantation qualified to vote in Plantation affairs to assemble at the schoolhouse in said Plantation on Monday, the 9th day of March 1942 at one o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles namely:

- Art. 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2 To hear and act on Treasurer's Report.
- Art. 3 To choose all necessary Pltn. officers for the ensuing year. Plantation Clerk, Collector of Taxes, Treasurer, three Assessors, Road Commissioner, one member of School Board, Truant Officer, Constable and Surveyor of Wood and Lumber.
- Art. 4 To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 for schools, including teacher's wages, fuel, janitor's service, high school tuition, books and supplies.
- Art. 5 To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 more or less for General Government, including officer's salaries, election expenses and Administrative expenses.
- Art. 6 To see what sum the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for Supt. of schools.
- Art. 7 To see what sum the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for Mother's Aid.
- Art. 8 To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Medical Examination of school children.
- Art. 9 To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for First Aid Medical supplies.
- Art. 10 To see what sum the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for schoolhouse Repair.
- Art. 11 To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 more or less for Island Cemetery.
- Art. 12 To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$225.00 for disposal of garbage.
- Art. 13 To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37.50 for schoolhouse Insurance.

- Art. 14 To see what sum the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our Natural Resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 5, Sec. 82 of the Revised Statutes, said money to be expended under direction of State of Maine Publicity Bureau.
- Art. 15 To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5.00 for Fire Fund.
- Art. 16 To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 more or less for repairs on Plantation Landing.
- Art. 17 To see if the Plantation will vote to allow 3% discount on taxes if paid before July 1st and to charge 6% interest after December 1st if not paid on or before that date.
- Art. 18 To see if the Plantation will vote to grant the assessors authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes should it be necessary.
- Art. 19 To see if the Plantation will vote to use the excise tax for the ensuing year for discounts and abatements on taxes.
- Art. 20 To see if the Plantation will vote to authorize the assessors on the behalf of the Plantation to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Plantation for non-payment of taxes, thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quit claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 21 To see what sum the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for Roads and Bridges.
- Art. 22 Article: --- To see if the Plantation will vote; that any and all boats, either in the daytime or night-time, shall if they so desire, dock and tie up at any part of the Monhegan Public Wharf or Landing: said boats to have free wharfage and no limit shall be set as to the length of time they may remain at said dock or wharf: Providing, such boat or boats if laying at slip, move out upon the approach of the mail boat or any other boat, whose Captain makes known his desire to come to the slip for the purpose of landing or taking on passengers, or for loading or unloading freight, or for any other necessary purpose. This shall not effect boats owned or operated by the United States Government, or boats or crafts laden with wood or oil, or any boat or craft so laden as to

render moving injurious or impossible.

nominating candidates for the following offices
to be voted for at the election to be held on the
second Monday in September next, viz:

United States Senator, Governor, Representatives to
Congress, State Senator, Register of Probate, County Treasurer,
Register of Deeds, Sheriff, County Attorney, County Commissioner,
Representative to Legislature.

The polls will be opened at nine o'clock, in the
forenoon, and continue open until five o'clock in the
afternoon, when they will close.

Voters not enrolled as members of a political party
entitled to nominate candidates will not be permitted
to vote. Voters entitled to enrollment may cause them-
selves to be enrolled at the polling places during the
primary election on taking and subscribing the oath
required by law, but said voters shall not be allowed
to vote at any primary election within the next six
months following said enrollment unless a new
voter, or a voter enrolling for the first time in
that municipality.

the Assessors on June 12th 7 o'clock to 9 o'clock P.M.
for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.







Channel Fifty-five (55) ft. wide. Starting midway between Monhegan and Manana Islands, at the south entrance of Monhegan Harbor abreast of the south end of Manana Pt., running N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. thro Monhegan Harbor, continuing by the north end of the Plant. wharf leaving a distance of twenty-five (25) ft. between said channel and said wharf. Continuing on the same course, N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. and width Fifty-five (55) feet for the distance of Three hundred (300) feet into open water.
