The Scattered/Spreading Church #6

Text: Acts 8:1-4.

Intro: The Church-ekklesia, the word translated "church" has the literal meaning of <u>people called out and called together</u>. It's a mistake to view Church as only a place or building. God's people are the church when gathering for singing, praying, ministry of the word and fellowship. It is a mistake to think the worship life of the church is a weekend or weekday focused event. God's people are meant to gather and scatter.

- Scattered/spreading-- to extend over a wider range, or cause something to cover a wider range than before. To make something widely known.
- We are to bring light into darkness but not become a part of it.

<u>Those</u> of Acts 8:4 speak to the plurality of the proclaimers—v4. The group is mention prior to specific individuals (Philip-8:5). The previous message emphasized "They went" Mk.16:20. The combinations of these passages support the biblical biography of believers as the body of Jesus Christ.

- Biography—a brief description that summarizes the characteristics of somebody or something. Biographical truths:
- 1. The Church is the body of Christ--people called out and called together-Matt.16:18.
- Build (oikodomos #3618 Strong's Concordance) to build a house, erect a building, to build (up from the foundation). To repair, to promote growth in Christian wisdom, affection, grace and strength.
- 2. It takes the entire church community (plural) to represent (officially act on behalf of another) Jesus Christ—Ro.12:3-6a. Three truths: unity, diversity and mutuality—each member belongs to all the others (v5); I Cor.12:12-27
- You're one person gifted by God to serve in some capacity. You can't do everything, but you can do something
 by the grace of God.
- 3. The Church is to emulate Jesus Christ—essence of celebrated communion. Jesus's body was sacrificed for our salvation—I Cor.11:23-26.

The understanding of the church as a body is easily lost in our individualistic culture. Part of Jesus building His Church is repairing the spirit of community.
