14th Sunday Ordinary Time Year C Luke 10:1-12, 17-20



“At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

14th Sunday Ordinary Time

Year C

Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Two missions? Yes, in Luke we hear about two separate mission operations. First the Twelve apostles in Luke 9:1-2, when Jesus calls together the Twelve and sends them out to preach the kingdom of God and to heal the sick. Then a second time in Luke 10:1-24, Jesus sends out an additional 72 disciples with very similar mission instructions about proclaiming the Kingdom of God. If we are into numbers, we can see the symbolism of 72 being the product of 12 x 6. Of course, to double the number 72, we get to 144, as in the perfect number symbolizing completeness, with the '144,000 marked believers' of the Book of Revelation 7:4 & 14:1. **BUT** beware not to take that number overly literal since right after Revelation says 144,000 the same passage goes on to say "a great multitude, *which no one could count*, from every nation & race" in Revelation 7:9!! So, a wise interpretation of the number 144,000 would be that this number signifies 'the leaders' being marked out or set apart as exemplary, and it does not mean that only 144,00 people will be saved at the end of time!

But how about that number of 72 disciples being called as auxiliary support, after the initial twelve apostles? We hear about a similar situation of 72 counselors being called to help Moses in the Old Testament. In the Book of Numbers 11:24-26, we read about 70 elders plus 2 more with Eldad and Medad (*who were tardy in showing up at the meeting time, but they still received their portion of the Holy Spirit*). This group of elder-leaders with Moses, becomes an institutional fixture in Hebrew life later known as the Sanhedrin of 70 or 72 ruling elders to guide the People of God (*an intriguing detail of history records that when the Hebrew Bible was translated into Greek-called the Septuagint-it was 70 translators (Moses and Holy Spirit make it 72!) were summoned by Ptolemy II to do the translation work- the 70 were supposed to be from each nation-language represented in the Genesis 10's Table of Nations*).

Yes, again, we humans can get too caught up in numbers. But basically we can find the number 70 (or 72) a lot in Hebrew & Christian history to reflect all the known nationalities or peoples of the world at the time of Jesus. So, the point of Jesus sending out an additional 72 disciples (after the initial 12 apostles) is that Jesus is emphasizing His status as our Universal Savior. His mission is to everyone all over the world. No one is left out from the Kingdom of God.

That's enough about who and how many were sent out by Jesus, let's focus now more on what Jesus told those leaders to do on this mission in His Name. This is the really exciting part, because accepting the mission is a **test of trust** on behalf of the disciples. Jesus sends them out with a lot to do but instructs them to not supply themselves with any resources on the way. In Luke 10:4, Jesus says "Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals." What, nothing? The disciples are to go on mission with no supplies! But this is a training in trust-God will provide for them all that they need, but not until they need it. They should not load themselves up with baggage, that can prevent them from actually ministering because they would be more busy maintaining supplies instead of ministering the Spirit to people. I am sure we are all familiar with that experience: Have you bought something you thought would save you time, and YOU ended up wasting time maintaining that 'time saving' device instead of it helping you! (*So if I spend all afternoon on my cellphone, trying to get the internet service fixed – & I can't use the landline phone because its long-distance service is not working either – who is helping who? Technology saving time?*)

But Jesus simplifies all of this – take nothing along! Jesus will give us what is needed for ministry (I must also keep in mind- **it is on Him-It is HIS ministry!**) And Jesus may not supply it until the exact minute it is called for (This is similar to when Jesus tells His followers not to sit around and think up clever defenses, because the Spirit will provide the persuading testimony when it is called for—Luke 12:12). We certainly see this in action when Jesus multiplies/supplies enough food to feed over 5,000 people (Lk 9:10-17), and when He scrapes up a room for the apostles and He to celebrate Passover together (Lk 22:7-38). Also, when He sends apostles to gather up a donated donkey for His triumphant ride into Jerusalem (Luke 19:29-44). Jesus works it out, but maybe not until is needed at that moment! We need to grow in our trust of Him. The missions become a training ground for the apostles/disciples. And I believe that when people saw this implicit trust among the disciples, that such faith had a profound effect upon them to be open themselves to believing the gospel. It certainly built up the credibility of the disciples for their teaching. But the real fruit of such faithful discipleship was that Jesus was made known through it and His Kingdom spread through the living out of such good faith trust! The Acts of the Apostles repeatedly speaks about the 'good favor and esteem' that Christians were held in by the people, as in Acts 2:47, 4:33 5:13 that mentions Christians "enjoyed the favor of all the people." It made an effect! Maybe the song could have been written, "They will know we are Christians, by our **Trust!**" Peace, Fr Brian
