

"We honor the pioneers of women's equality by doing our part to realize the great American dream

Women's Equality Day—August 26th

Since the inception of Women's Equality Day established in 1973 and now celebrated on August 26, it has evolved from not only being an annual observance of the anniversary of the first time voting rights were extended to women in the U.S. but as a day that acknowledges the full and equal participation of women in our Nation's life. Unfortunately, many of the remarkable contributions made by women throughout the present and past centuries have gone unacknowledged.

To that point, the U.S. marked the 50th anniversary of the historic Apollo 11 moonwalk on Saturday, July 20th. Space films of the moon, outer space, and NASA's role in the space race played non-stop on most media outlets. One film shown repeatedly was "Hidden Figures," the 2016 Oscar-nominated movie featuring the true-life story of three very talented women of color, who worked at NASA's early space program in the 1960's.

Mary Jackson, Dorothy Vaughan, and Katherine Johnson used their intelligence, courage, and leadership skills to combat the racial and gender discrimination they experienced at NASA. Unfortunately this same painful challenge of discrimination continues to plague women of color today, especially in the area of equal pay for equal work.

In April 2019 the U.S. Census Bureau issued a statistical report for 2018 which pointed to an on-going gender based wage gap that is harmful to women, their families and the economy. The report also highlighted the fact that the gender based wage gap is especially damaging for women of color, who work full-time, year-round and are generally paid 61 cents for every dollar paid to white, non-Hispanic men. Some reasons given for this wage discrepancy are gender and racial discrimination, workplace harassment, job segregation and a lack of workplace policies that support family caregiving. Generally, women employed full-time, year-round are paid **80 cents** for every dollar paid to men. This is not the case for women of color.

In light of the statistical facts cited here, we are called to reflect and act on how we can ensure equal pay for equal work for all women, especially women of color, and their families who are currently living with these unjust life and societal circumstances?
