

I am writing this on Election Day and I predict someone will win. If it's a tie I suppose we could try having two presidents. Amazingly we did just that at one time.

In 2004 it was my honor and privilege to be a delegate to the Presbyterian Church USA General Assembly. Although it was billed as the 216th assembly it was actually the 21st. In 1983, the year before I was ordained, two branches of

the Presbyterian Church committed to patch up their differences over sweet tea, *the War of Northern Aggression*, and the meaning of "well, bless your little heart." The rift started over whether one person could own another. The Bible clearly states that's OK. Sometime in the eighteenth century people began to hold a yardstick up to the Bible, and declared that if "Love God; love your neighbor," is the golden rule then owning your neighbor might just need to be reconsidered as falling short of the golden rule. Perhaps past practices considered normal might just be shown to be inappropriate by later generations. This criticism was easier to state in places where there were very few slaves since the industrial revolution was overtaking human muscle. The industrialized north had more abolitionists while the agricultural south had more slave owners. Then came the national election of 1860. We Presbyterians stayed together for a little bit, but by 1861 the churches in the Confederate States of America severed ties with the Union churches. Church and state might be separate, but they went away together.

In 2004 the PCUSA General Assembly met in Richmond, Virginia, the capitol of Dixie. I marveled at how unembarrassed we all were that it took us a century and more to patch up what the nation managed to do in five; albeit five bloody horribly violent wasted, years. Meeting Presbyterians from all over America convinced me that diversity is our strength and we have a great deal to learn from one another. As I write this on Election Day it is my sincere prayer that we will not choose again to be two nations. The scars of the Civil War must be remembered so that we do not count it as one Civil War out of many. If we fail to be us there will be no US.

My prayer, and I ask you to join those prayers, is also for our church. We are in a long line of Christians who see the fate of our nation as a shared responsibility. We are the salt of the earth, but when we hurl it at each other there's none left for seasoning and preservation. Since Church disagreements are family disagreements they can last over generations. This thwarts our mission while making us look ridiculous in the eyes of a skeptical world. Bear in mind **they** know we are **supposed** to love one another.
