IMPORTANT NEWS: We NEED you. Please come to lodge and schools to help mentor our newer masons.

FROM THE EAST

I'm happy to report that Elmer Timberman, at its December 2019 Stated, successfully elected and installed its officers for the ensuing Masonic year, appointed GL proxies, reaffirmed our Trustees, and elected a new Board Member to our Temple Corporation due to a term limit. It was a sparse crowd, but we did it. Thank you for your trust and confidence in me as your Master a second year in a row. I am humbled and hope to continue the good work WE have been doing. It is warming to see the growth in Lodge. Also, thank you to our top-notch installing team. RW Michael Paul Bible did a great job as our Installing Officer. RW Matthew Todd Szramoski completed his first official Blue Lodge appearance as our newly installed Grand Junior Deacon by serving as the Installing Marshal. And, thanks also to WB Samuel Abarquez Flores and WB Ramon Manalo Llamas from Springfield Lodge (our sister lodge) for serving as the Installing Secretary and Assistant Installing Marshal, respectively.

My theme this year is, "Getting Back to the "Work" of Masonry." Elmer Timberman Lodge had a great year last year. We fell short of the Hillman Award due to our weakness in ritual. My theme alludes to the goal of improving that aspect of our weakness and become a Lodge known for its ritual, once again. I have ordered a change in the way our ritual schools will be formatted to help in this regard. Please see my comments later in my comments below. I mentioned we had a great year in 2019. Here are some highlights...I am sure I missed some, but here are the wavetops:

- Conducted six (6) Masonic fraternal and four (4) youth organization visits.
- Conducted Invigorated the Lodge through ritual by initiating two candidates into the Fraternity.
- Invigorated our Widow's Program.

- Traveled to and conducted Masonic Funeral in Statesboro, NC for WBro. Clarence Gatton when Grand Lodge of NC could not furnish a Brother to conduct the funeral locally; did so with less than three days' notice.
- Fixed our Temple Corporation; dissolved it and reinstated it; led extensive re-write/update of Temple Corporation By-Laws (grew from 7 pages to 11 pages) to ensure position descriptions were explicit and offer more tools to manage and operate the Corporation, which will ensure the continued viability of the Corporation.
- Caught lodge up on veteran awards (6 were in arrears, and 5 planned for future).
- Reduced the number of brethren with dues in arrears from 45 to 13 and spent over 80 hours "righting" our roster.
- Regularly engaged with Widows of the lodge to include performing work projects around their homes.
- Established a plan with Temple Corporation and Lodge to update the Lodge.
- Provided grocery store gift cards, food donations, and manpower to support District 1A event to provide outreach to government employees that were furloughed during a partial government shutdown at the beginning of the year. Cards that were not used, donated to a local charity to help with foodservice needs.
- Made several donations to Masonic, appendant body, and youth organizations.
- Granted a college scholarship.
- Host location of the joint District 1A and 1B picnic.
- Earmarked \$2,500.00 towards the GLOVA sign project.
- Assisted with several Blood Drives.
- Invigorated our Community Builder Award program.
- Donated \$225.00 to Wreaths Across America.
- Contributed 1/9th of the cost for a Ray of Light at MAHOVA as part of a District 1A initiative.

As we look to 2020, following are some of my goals for the ensuing Masonic year. We need your help to make these a reality...once again:

- Increase the strength of lodge to ensure sustainability.
- Increase organic ritual, catechism, and proficiency capability in the lodge.
- Reinvigorate ETL54 Scholarship and update Bylaws.
- Assist with all District Blood Drives.
- Complete two Widow support events.
- Celebrate both Saint John's Days.
- Host youth organizations.
- Earn the Noah Hillman Award.
- Facilitate movement of the Traveling Gavel.
- Make two Community Builder presentations.
- Hold a Table Lodge in honor of Elmer Timberman.

- Make several gifts to Annandale community organizations.
- Make several gifts to Masonic and appendant body organizations (i.e. GL scholarship fund, MAHOVA, etc).
- Rehab the Lodge Room (Paint, chair rail, fancy work in stationed officer positions, new carpet, remove and replace movie-style chairs with seating solution with armrests, and so on).

To capitalize on the absolutely stellar level of masonic ritual expertise in the District, we are shifting some of our schools to coincide with those being offered throughout the District. This will encourage fellowship with our Brothers in the District as well as learn from some ritual masters. Effective immediately, we will utilize these schools to augment our Lodge ritual schools (two of the three will be District schools). They take place on the 1st Tuesday of each month (7:00 PM) at Kemper Macon Ware Lodge and the 3rd Wednesday of each month (7:00 PM) at Elmer Timberman Lodge. We will maintain a Simmons-DeRossi Ritual School at Elmer Timberman on the 4th Monday of each month (7:00 PM).

Plans are still in the works to present two Community Builder Awards; one for the Fairfax County Police Department (FCPD) and one for the Annandale Volunteer Fire Department (AFVD). The AFVD provided their nomination and I am standing by for the nomination from the FCPD. We will visit each organization and make the presentation among their colleagues. Look for an announcement with the date and time. Please join me if within the length of your cabletow.

The Division Leadership Conference schedule is out. I am also all of our officers to attend one of the three closest locations. I also encourage any Brother who would like to attend to do so. This is a great opportunity for officers to meet their Grand Line counterparts and to fellowship with Lodge Counterparts from around the Commonwealth. The locations are Alexandria (Saturday, March 21st), Warrenton (Friday, March 20th), and Richmond (Saturday, January 25, 2020). See the Lodge calendar below for more information on each date.

I am following suit with my change last year with regards to attire. Attire for lodge, except on the occasion of the official DDGM visit to ETL, will remain business casual (collared shirt and slacks, at a minimum) through November. The aim is to encourage a comfortable and welcoming environment. You have provided positive feedback on this, so it makes sense to keep the status quo.

Finally, brethren, dinner preceding our Stated Communications starts at 6:30PM and Lodge opens at 7:30PM. Please join us and bring some friends and potential petitioners!

MASONIC EDUCATION

MYSTICAL NUMBERS. One of the many interesting and important assertions made by Dr. Mackey in his History of Freemasonry, which may be found in the Wisconsin Consistory library, Scottish Rite cathedral, is that a predilection for mystical numbers occurs in all the churches of the mediaeval period. Thus, the cathedral of Rheims has seven entrances, and both it and the cathedral of Chartres have seven chapels around the choir. The choir of Notre Dame at Paris has seven arcades. The cross aisle is 144 feet long, which is sixteen times nine; and 42 feet wide which is six times 7. The towers of Notre Dame are 204 feet high, which is 17 times 12, the astronomical number. The length of the church of Notre Dame at Rheims is 408 feet, or 34 times 12. The cathedral of Notre Dame has 297 columns; but 297 divided by 3 gives 99, and this divided by 3 again produces 33. The naves of St. Ouen, at Rouen, and of the cathedrals of Strasburg and Chartres are of the same length -- 244 feet. The Saint Chapelle, at Paris, is 110 feet long and 27 feet wide; but 110 is 10 times 11, and 27 is 3 times 9. In these few examples we have developed the numbers 3,7,9,10,11 and 12, all of which have been retained in the mystical system of the Speculative Freemasons; and their appearance among the mediaeval Masons could have been neither by accident or coincidence, but must have arisen from a pre-determined selection. CELESTIAL LODGE

Brother Albert S. Gastoukian, born on 14 August 1929, laid up his working tools and passed on to the Celestial Lodge above on 2 November 2019. Brother Gastoukian was a 58 year veteran and LMIP Mason at Elmer Timberman Lodge No. 54 of Annandale, VA; Initiated 17 October 1950; Passed on 2 November 1950; and, Raised on 25 November 1950. Albert S Gastoukian of Springfield, VA, went peacefully surrounded by his wife Sigrid and family to a higher calling at his home in Mineral, Virginia. His parents Kurkein and Sirarpie, and brother Michelle, predeceased him. His family knows him as a lover and keeper of knowledge with an insatiable desire to learn, retain and teach even the most obscure facts. His intellectual pursuits would have made him comfortable interacting with the philosophers of another age. Albert is self described as a husband, father, teacher, linguist, engineer, manager and freemason. He wrote that this juncture in time would be a step to eternal life with the Architect of the Universe. Brother Gastoukian was a 58 year veteran and LMIP Mason at Elmer Timberman Lodge No 54 of Annandale, VA; Initiated October 17, 1950; Passed on November 2, 1950; and Raised on November 25, 1950. Albert was born in France on August 14, 1929 to parents who'd survived the Armenian genocide. He emigrated to the U.S. in 1948, joined the Air Force in 1953, and proudly became a U.S citizen. He met Sigrid on a blind date, and after only 7 weeks, they committed to a marriage that would span over 65 years. Their family grew to include 3 children, 11 grandchildren and 4+ great grandchildren. His work on Earth is done, but his wife, Sigrid, children, Ellen (Mike) Burgess, Peter (Ann) Gastoukian, Ingrid (Bill) Alewine, grandchildren, Michelle, Sean, Kelly (Reed), Kirsten (Jeff), Courtney, Nils (Josh), Ryan, Nicole, William (Yawen), Noah and Thor, great grandchildren, Ben, William, Logan, Maxton, and ones yet to be born, believe his work continues in their hearts. A steadfast family man Albert was proud of every family member's accomplishments. Following his Air Force service, Albert went on to work with RCA as an engineer and manager. After several overseas assignments, Sigrid and Albert settled in Springfield in 1966. He retired from RCA in 1984 and enjoyed many worldwide adventures with Sigrid during their retirement years. He was active in Sons of Norway, The Odd Fellows, The VFW and several language clubs. As a world traveler and "citizen of the world" he cultivated an appreciation for other cultures. His funeral service was held on November 23, at one pm at National Memorial Park, 7482 Lee Highway, Falls Church, VA 22042. 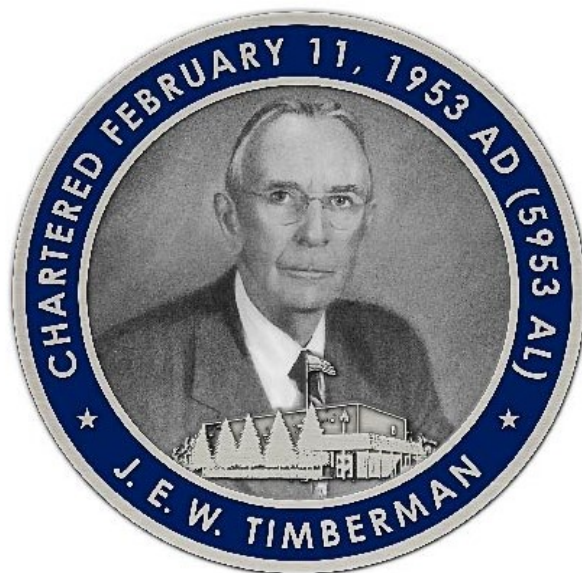
