RE: EMT Scope of Practice

DATE: June 14, 2000

It has been brought to my attention that there is a misconception as to the scope of practice of the Emergency Medical Technician-Basic provider. Please be advised of the following:

- EMT-Basics are not trained to attend to a patient with an IV, or monitor the IV during transport unless they have been trained in IV Maintenance and are recognized by me, the Medical Program Director, to operate under my protocols as such.
- If an EMT-IV Technician, EMT-Intermediate, or Paramedic level provider leaves a patient with an IV in the care of the EMT-Basic to drive the ambulance, it may be considered abandonment.
- An exception to this is when a heparin or saline lock has been installed on the IV (not at the hospital). If this were the case, intravenous fluids would not be part of the continuum of care. As long as the scope of care does not exceed the EMT-Basics scope of practice, the higher level EMS provider could drive and the EMT-B could attend the patient.
