

#### Lighting the Third Candle of the Advent Wreath



#### Collecting plastic grocery bags for a good cause!

Our Hospitality Committee is collecting used plastic grocery bags for a project to make mats to give to homeless people. The bags must NOT have any holes. The committee is working with a woman who creates the mats, like the one pictured here, by hand -weaving the plastic bags. It takes about 500 bags to
