

- Contact information for important people and care providers.
- A list of medicines you need, dosage instructions, and any allergies.
- Contact information for your durable medical provider.
- Need-to-know information for first responders and others who might need to help you.

Prepare For Emergencies Now: Helpful Information For Older Americans

The likelihood that you and your family will recover from an emergency tomorrow often depends on the planning and preparation done today. While each person's abilities and needs are unique, every individual can take steps to prepare for all kinds of emergencies from fires and floods to potential terrorist attacks. By evaluating your own personal needs and making an emergency plan that fts those needs, you and your loved ones can be better prepared. These pages outline commonsense measures older Americans can take to start preparing for emergencies before they happen.

Get a Kit — or two — of Emergency Supplies

The first step is to consider how an emergency might affect your individual needs. Plan to make it on your own, for at least three days. It's possible that you will not have access to a medical facility or even a drugstore. It is crucial that you think about what kinds of resources you use on a daily basis and what you might do if those resources are limited or not available.

Basic Supplies: Think first about the basics for survival – food, water, clean air, and any life-sustaining items you require. Consider two kits. In one kit put everything you will need to stay where you are and make it on your own for a period of time. The other kit should be a lightweight, smaller version you can take with you if you have to leave your home.

Recommended basics include:

- Water, one gallon per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of nonperishable food and a can opener if needed
- Hand crank radio, flashlight and extra batteries, first aid kit, whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags, and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities, local maps
- Pet food, extra water and supplies for your pet or service animal
- Medications and Medical Supplies, with a copy of your prescriptions or treatment information
- Talk with your providers (dialysis, home health, etc) about their emergency plans
- If you use medical equipment in your home that requires electricity, how will you operate it?
- Extra eyeglasses, hearing aids and batteries, wheelchair batteries, and oxygen
- Copies of your medical insurance, Medicare and Medicaid cards readily available.
- Include document copies: records, wills, power of attorney, deeds, social security numbers, credit/bank information,
 - and tax records, in a waterproof container.
- Names and numbers of those in your personal support network, as well as medical providers.
- Also be sure you have cash or travelers checks in your kits in case you need to purchase supplies.
