## **PASTOR'S PONDERINGS**

Fellow Redeemed, happy November! I don't know about you, but I am glad to see the change of color in the leaves, to feel the coolness of the fall morning, and to taste the delicious food that accompanies a day of thanksgiving for all the many blessings our Lord gives to us so graciously, even during this time of Covid-19.

For us here at Immanuel, November is a busy time as well. The fall bazaar beautifully hosted by WinGS will certainly be a delight for ourselves and the surrounding communities. And let us not forget the Holy Divine service on November 1 where we celebrate both the Festival of All Saints (where we remember all the saints who have fallen asleep in the Lord this past year), and the Rite of Confirmation for Lukas Maloney, both of which will be in unison with the angels and archangels and all the host of heaven as we gather around the altar to receive the Lord's true body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins and the strengthening of our faith.



Finally, the church year draws to a close on November 22, where we invite you to celebrate with us Christ the King Sunday at our 10:30 service, followed by our Thanksgiving Day service at 10:00 am.

But don't let the end of the church year discourage you because on November 29, we will come together again and will celebrate the start of a new church year which begins with the season of Advent.

A note about Advent: Advent is the first season in the 'Time of Christmas.' The calendar of the Church begins with Advent (from the Latin *adventus*, which means "coming into"), a four-week period of preparation before Christmas. The Savior's birth is second in importance only to His resurrection on Easter Sunday. And this year for Advent, our theme will be *Jesse Tree* (see next page for more information about our theme from Concordia Publishing House).

I pray God's richest blessings to all of you during this joyous time of the year. May our Lord continue to watch over you and give you His love, grace, joy, and peace.

### **THE JESSE TREE IS THE JESUS TREE!**

“There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of  
Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear  
fruit.” (Isaiah 11:1)

Advent begins this month. It is a time to reflect,  
pray, and worship the Christ who came, who comes,  
and who will come again. Imagine a world some two  
thousand years ago in the weeks before the birth of  
the Babe of Bethlehem. People were busy doing  
whatever it was that defined their lives at that  
moment. For some, it was struggling against hunger,  
fear, and desperation. For others, it was enjoying  
their wealth and ease. For yet others, it was simply  
dealing with the pressures of their lives. But for all,  
the weeks we call, “Advent” were just days and  
nights lived in darkness.

And indeed, it is a dark world. God had created the  
world to live in union with Him. He breathed life into  
the father of our race, Adam, a creature of dust. He  
had formed Eve from the side of Adam and had  
joined the two together and to Himself. How bright  
the world must have been as Eden lived in harmony  
with the Creator.

But darkness came. Those created and loved by God  
rebelled against Him, bringing a darkness that  
permeated all creation. Death had entered through  
sin, and as the children of Adam filled the world,  
they took with them the darkness of that dreadful  
day in Eden when sin and death entered the world.


It was a world of darkness cut off from the source of  
all light, the Creator. Yet a light was breaking into  
the world. A young girl carried in her virgin womb a  
Son. This daughter of Eve was about to give birth to  
the One who would be the light of the world. This  
infant would reverse forever the horror of  
humanity's fall into sin and death and darkness. This  
was the miracle of miracles: our human sister Mary  
became, by the power of the Holy Spirit, the  
theotokos, the mother of God, the bearer of the  
Savior of the World.

No human eye could perceive it that night. All that  
could be seen was a child. Yet this child would  
forever destroy the darkness, for He brought life  
into death, and His light was to be the light of the  
world.

Every force of Satan would seek to put that light out. Herod would attempt to destroy Him by killing every male infant. Scribes and Pharisees would seek to silence Him as He spoke words of life. Failing to silence Him, they would seek to kill Him. Some thirty-three years after the first Christmas, the Babe of Bethlehem would be nailed to a cross. But this is what He had come to do. The Advent story, including the culminating Christmas story, is about a baby who had been born to die-yet not just to die but to be placed in the utter darkness of a tomb and on Easter morning to burst forth from the tomb. When the child of Mary rose from the grave, the light that began at Bethlehem shone so brightly that no one can put it out.

This Advent, we gather in the name of Jesus and consider His great story anew. The Jesse Tree is filled with symbols telling the story of Jesus from creation to His second coming. The story of the Bible, Old and New Testament alike, is the story of Jesus. He is the Seed of Jesse's tree, He is the Root of Jesse's tree, He is the Life of Jesse's tree, and He is the First Fruit of Jesse's tree. As the Church will sing with the angels on Christmas Day, "To God on high be glory and peace to all the earth" (LSB 383).

MaryLou Yopes Plutschak of Preston, Maryland, beloved wife of Glen E. Plutschak, passed away on October 2, 2020 after a private and courageous battle with breast cancer. She was born June 9, 1949 in Santa Ana, California to Mary Louise Leinberger Yopes and the late Paul Frederick Yopes. Her father was a Berkeley-trained engineer and

geologist who traveled the world as a mining expert, settling back in the United States after meeting Mary Louise in Tustin, California in 1947.

MaryLou excelled in school-especially in reading - graduating from Bethesda-Chevy Chase Senior High School in 1967 as an "A" student. She went on to earn a B.A. and M.A. in Psychology at the University of Maryland. In 1972 she began her career with the Division of Parole and Probation in Prince George's County as a probation agent. MaryLou quickly rose through the ranks and was eventually promoted to Regional Administrator in charge of all operations and staff for the Eastern Shore of Maryland. She was known for her analytic skills and quiet, thoughtful approach to organizational issues, leading many strategic workgroups and committees. After 35 years of service she retired in 2008 with the highest commendations.

After her first marriage ended, in 1995 MaryLou married Glen Plutschak from Preston, Maryland. Glen also worked as a parole and probation agent in MaryLou's division before eventually being promoted to Regional Administrator for Central Maryland. Glen asked MaryLou to join him near his family farm in Preston and they made their home there. She grew to love the beauty of the Eastern Shore and its communities, and took special pleasure in tending the flowers, shrubs and vegetables in her extensive garden. MaryLou liked to read to Glen while traveling in the car -- and even as he drove combines and tractors. MaryLou and Glen loved to line dance, travel, and enjoyed cruises together in many parts of the world, often accompanied by family or friends.

After marrying Glen, MaryLou soon became a doting step mother to Glen's son Brad and his wife Heather,

and later the beloved "Mimi" to their children Hayden and Molly.

MaryLou was confirmed in Glen's church, Immanuel Lutheran, and volunteered there as a member of Women in God's Service (WINGS). She also played with the church hand bell ensemble. Having counseled adults as a parole and probation agent, after retirement MaryLou put her skills to work as a volunteer serving at-risk youth in foster care. As a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) she worked with children who had experienced abuse or neglect, and made assessments and recommendations for the supervising court. She also assisted an older adolescent, teaching him how to drive and pass the motor vehicle test, as well as how to open and manage a bank account.

In addition to Glen, Brad, Heather, Hayden and Molly, MaryLou is survived by her mother (Mary Yopes of Bethesda, Maryland), and three siblings and their spouses (Eric Yopes and Amelia Kaymen of San Francisco, California, Martha and Barry Lennon of Chevy Chase, Maryland, and Jennifer Angelo and Jack Mullen of Washington, D.C.).

Funeral services were held on Wednesday, October 7, 2020 at 1:00 pm at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Preston with Pastor David Casey-Motley officiating. Interment followed at the Junior Order Cemetery in Preston. Pallbearers were: Eric Karge, Robbie Karge, Brad Plutschak, Hayden Plutschak, Eric Yopes and David Harper Sr.

The family would like to thank MaryLou's doctors, nurses and staff in Easton and at the University of Maryland for their dedicated efforts on her behalf, and the nurses and social workers at Compass Regional Hospice for their sensitive and thoughtful services.
