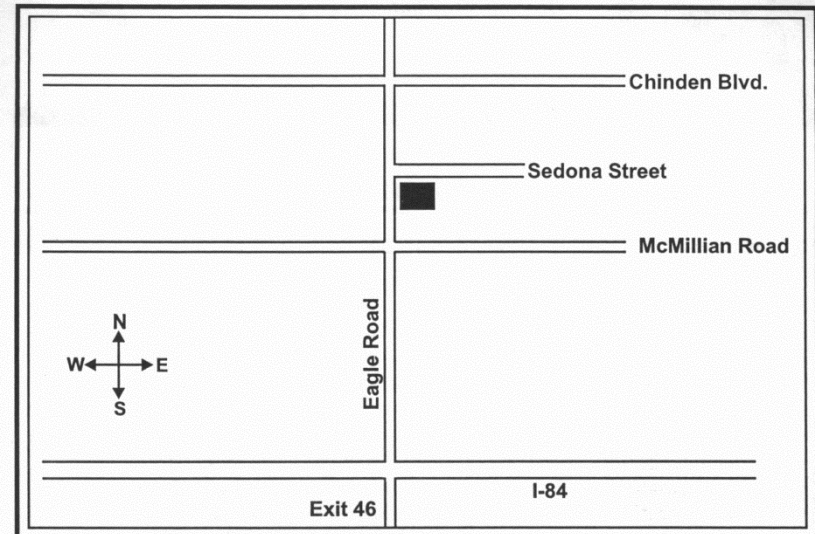

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INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL PATIENTS

1. If possible we prefer to consult with all patients on a day prior to surgery. Please bring this slip to your appointment
2. **Do not eat or drink anything** for 6 hours prior to your surgery.
NO FOOD • NO LIQUID • NO WATER
3. Please arrange for a friend or relative to drive you home after the operation. You may not under any circumstances drive or operate machinery until the next day.
4. The night before surgery eat a light meal and retire early.
Do not consume any alcoholic beverage.
5. Please refrain from smoking for at least one day prior to surgery.
6. Your mouth and teeth should be well cleaned to help avoid infection.

Note: *Please call our office immediately if symptoms of a head or chest cold develop...a change of appointment may be necessary.*
