Purpose: The purpose of this bylaw is in response to the instructions received from Shriners International. Shriners International has directed us to apply for a new EIN number for tax purposes. In order to apply for a new EIN, a name change is required.

Name Change: Change name of the Association from International Association Legions of Honor to International Legions of Honor and change abbreviation IALOH to ILOH.



- Finally, we must make it FUN and worthwhile, not just for the Noble but for his Lady as well. Far too many meetings consist of social time before, a basic and bland meeting during, and perhaps a social time after. Do something to set your meeting apart. Have Nobles speak different nights about their military careers and experiences. Have discussions on famous Masonic military leaders. Make it different.

Enough on that for now. In just a few short weeks we will embark (literally) on the continuing path to support this amazing organization with our annual meeting, elections, and installation of officers. I am looking forward to the camaraderie and fellowship that comes from these gatherings, and I am also eager to learn more about how other officers, units, and temples promote the success and growth of their own LOH groups. 
