The Reverend's Ruminations - February 2025

With the oddly variable temps of a second dry midwinter upon us, I pray that you are finding ways to embrace the unexpectedly brown, frozen landscape around us and keeping yourself spiritually connected, while doing your best to avoid any symptoms associated with "seasonal affective disorder." We've actually had some fairly sunny (albeit short) days lately; but if the long, dark nights cause you to struggle with SAD symptoms like oversleeping, low energy, appetite changes, or loss of interest in activities you once enjoyed, I pray that you take such signs seriously and reach out for medical help. I'm also available to talk if you just need to process a lesser feeling some refer to as "the winter doldrums." Together we can weather many storms!

Though it may not seem so yet, we <u>are</u> already gaining minutes of daylight. I promise, spring is not as far away as it may seem!?! As we look expectantly toward warmer and longer days ahead, may we draw strength from the words of our Savior who said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life" (John 8:12, NRSV).



If you are looking for inspiration during the inevitable chilly days remaining this month, this is an excellent time to dig into your Bible a bit and examine the passages that will be part of our worship services in the weeks ahead:

The epistle lessons for the last three weeks of February will examine the 15th chapter of First Corinthians, where the Apostle Paul examines the core Christian truth of Christ's resurrection and its impact on our understanding of the resulting resurrection of believers after death, as well as our vision of what a resurrection body will look like.

The gospel readings will come from the 4th, 5th, and 6th chapters of Luke, including stories of Jesus struggling for acceptance in his own hometown, helping some as-of-yet-unknown fishermen pull in a huge catch before calling them to be his first disciples, and then delivering what has come to be called his "Sermon on the Plain."

In my sermons based on the Old Testament lectionary readings, we'll be exploring highlights of Jeremiah's 1st and 17st chapters (in which the prophet prepares to carry God's word to the people, and later teaches on the importance of trusting God instead of trusting in one's own flesh), as well as the opening of Isaiah's 6st chapter, where we'll encounter his famous response, "Here am I; send me!"







Crunchy Pineapple Salad

Sherry Larson made this for the Church Family Reunion Potluck

8 oz. cream cheese 1/3 cup sugar 8 oz. Cool Whip

20 oz. can pineapple (crushed or tidbits), drained

Mix cream cheese with sugar. Add drained pineapple and Cool Whip. Refrigerate. (Can be made ahead of time.)


1 cup crushed pretzels
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup butter, melted
1/2 cup chopped pecans

Stir pretzels, sugar, butter and pecans together. Line a baking sheet with a silicone mat or parchment paper. Spread it with the pretzel mixture. Bake for 10—20 minutes in a 350 degree oven stirring occasionally. Cool. Break apart.

Fold in the pretzel mixture right before serving. Enjoy!
