

CMA Board – COVID-19 Policy

CMA will follow closure directives by Governor, CDE, CSI, and align with geographic district. Currently, per CDE:

- Attendance will not be taken
- Hours / days will be waived
- Staff/teacher evaluations normally mandated by law will be waived
- State assessments have been cancelled.

CMA will continue payroll as normal through the end of this fiscal year, as long as there are no changes in state funding.

CMA will promote distance learning at home that aligns with CMA's academic program.

- CMA will lend Chromebooks to families that do not have home computers and provide info on free internet services which are available. Parents are to be responsible financially for the return of loaned equipment in good condition.
- For families of essential workers or single parents who feel overwhelmed, Ms. Stahnke may offer exemption from "Specials" classes work.
- SPED services will still be offered through online meeting platforms. IEP meetings will be held through online meetings as they would normally occur.
- ELL support services will continue through phone calls and online meetings.
- Teachers will be available online or by phone to answer questions from parents or students during designated "office hours."

CMA will provide support for teachers will be given through regular online meetings.

Because education is considered an essential function, groups of no more than 10 persons may meeting in the CMA building for educational purposes. Social distancing must be observed and disinfecting is to follow. Those in high-risk categories will be encouraged NOT to come to the building.

Because students often depend on our free breakfast and lunch program, we will recommend District 11's free meal sites and offer help from our food pantry.

Mental health supports will be available from our school counselor through online meetings or phone calls.

When the COVID-19 "Stay at home" order is lifted, CMA will continue with procedures as recommended by CSI and the Colorado Public Health Dept.

Grades will be frozen at the end of third quarter. Additional work during the COVID-19 shutdown will be considered for raising a student's grades, but cannot lower those grades for the 2019-20 school year.
