

### "Slot Whisperer" Sentenced

Sara King sure had a real good time—and now she's paying the piper. The disbarred lawyer, ex-wife of a Saudi prince, and glam queen who, according to one ex-friend, "loved money and had no soul" pled guilty to wire fraud and money laundering a couple of years ago and was sentenced in May to 21 months in prison, three years of supervised release, and restitution to the tune of the \$8.7 million out of which she bilked "investors" to support her lavish spree, which included a stay of six months in one of the Wynn's most exclusive villas. Dubbing herself the "Slot Whisperer" with an "unbeatable strategy" for high-stakes slots, King ran through the high seven figures playing the machines non-stop, which of course the Wynn was happy to facilitate—until she ran out of other people's money. Her scam was offering a 10% return on money invested in the short-term high-interest loans her company

made to celebrities, professional athletes, and other high-net-worth people who needed quick cash and used their cars, yachts, sports contracts, etc. as collateral. But all the investment money went into the Wynn's coffers and Ms. King will spend the better part of the next two years behind bars.

#### Circa Football Contests Get Bigger

Circa Sports has announced another record-breaking year for its football contests. Circa Survivor and Circa Million VII will combine for the highest payout to date, \$21 million guaranteed. Additionally, Circa is debuting Circa Grandissimo, an ultra-luxury survivor-style contest with \$1.5 million guaranteed and \$100,000 per entry. 

### Foxy Bingo Survey Says!

A study of 2,000 adults, 500 of whom sport a mullet, found those who sported the hairstyle enjoyed an average of five nights out a month; while the non-mulleted folk lagged behind with an average of only three. Being a free spirit, somewhat mischievous, and "doing the unexpected" topped a list of attributes those with the 80s-inspired look, believe they have. While those with more conventional cuts were less likely to think of themselves as a fashion-follower, and only seven per cent like to "make an impression" when they're out. A spokesperson for Foxy Bingo, which commissioned the research to launch its pop-up "mulletonly salon" in Newcastle, England said: "It's no surprise to us that those with mullets are having more fun." Mulleted individuals also self-describe themselves as more 'influential' in their friend groups than those with more traditional trims (66 per cent vs 37 per cent). And they also socialize with colleagues a lot more than people with more conservative haircuts. The study also saw Rod Stewart's blowdried masterpiece named the best celebrity mullet of all time, narrowly edging out David Bowie's red shock of locks as Ziggy Stardust. All of this research and the wacky pop-up were part of a marketing blitz by Foxy Bingo to promote their "anything goes attitude and northern charm."

#### Cases Dismissed Because of Police Bingo Game

Last month we reported on an investigation into thirteen police officers who were playing a type of bingo while on duty in Bozeman, Montana. According to a press conference, two teams of patrol officers were engaged in a bingo competition, where success in the game hinged on whether they engaged on actions listed on the bingo card with some officers caught playing while on duty. Now, some of the criminal cases that were handled

by the officers involved in the game are being dismissed. According to Bozeman Police Chief Jim Veltkamp, in mid-January, 13 officers, including two sergeants, took part in an on-duty game of bingo. Veltkamp explained, "It did look like your standard bingo card. Then they filled in squares on the card with things that they wanted to see happen or have happen in order to check off that box on the bingo card." Veltkamp said the game went on for 12 days before being shut down. During that time, officers involved with the game sent 24 misdemeanor cases to city court and 11 felony cases to the County Attorney's office. After reviewing the cases, Gallatin County Attorney Audrey Cromwell has decided to dismiss four of the pending felony charges and declined to prosecute five others. Cromwell stated, "I made the determination that to best protect the constitutional and due process rights of the defendants, and to ensure fairness of their trials, the cases should be dismissed." Cromwell explained that once a case is dismissed by the court, all hearings are vacated, bond is exonerated, and the case is closed. She acknowledged that this decision was "a tough call."

#### Our Prisons Must be Full

Are we short on prison space in this country? We must be. It's the only logical explanation for so many criminals being given probation instead of prison time.

For example, there were the scammers who sold misbranded N95 masks during the pandemic and price gouged hospitals. The masks were promised to be approved by the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health when they were not and were accompanied by testresult literature that was actually for a different mask. Hospitals paid \$2.6 million for the masks that had much lower filtration efficiency.

So what was the punishment? One year of probation and a fine of only \$9,500.

Then there was the real estate agent property manager who didn't tell anybody about the lead-based paint in the housing where veterans lived with their families The agent knew this and still signed rental agreements without notifying residents about the paint. A baby living there was found to have high blood lead levels because of the lead in the paint.

The agent's scammer pals, a hazardous material mitigation service, were hired to go in and clean up the lead paint. They didn't and were eventually nailed with one count of the False Claims Act. And after putting lives in danger, what was the punishment for the real estate agent and the scammer pals? Probation and fines.

Then there was the guy who schemed to grab Covid funding to the tune of nearly a half million dollars. Punishment: a fine and — you guessed it — probation.

And what of the guy who groped a student nurse at a VA hospital, a case of abusive sexual contact? The guidelines indicate he could have gotten up to two years in prison. Yet he gets a free pass. Once again: probation

I can only conclude that our prisons are full. There's no other explanation for only giving probation to these criminals.


#### Dear Fannie,

#### **BREAKFAST STRATA**

- 2 packages Brown and Serve Sausage Links
- 8 slices of white bread, cubed
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese 5 eggs
- 2 ½ cups milk
- 3/4 cup heavy cream
- 3/4 teaspoon dry mustard

Grease an 8-by-12 baking dish with non-stick cooking spray. Place the bread cubes along the bottom of the pan. Cut the sausage links into bite-size pieces. Mix the remaining ingredients in a medium-size bowl. Top the bread with the contents of the bowl. Refrigerate overnight. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Bake uncovered for 1½ hours. Serves 8.

#### Hi LGG,

This is an issue that comes up from time to time—an impression by players that certain people must somehow be getting some kind of advantage that allows them to win more.

Let me start out by saying that a lot of work has gone into the development of computerized Bingo gaming to guard against cheating. This leaves the only possible advantage as frequencypeople going more often and playing more cards than their competitors. But even then, the odds of any particular number coming up is even across the board.

Your letter does highlight an important point, however. You say that in the eyes of players, the manager's family members "appear" to win a lot. It is really an impression you are talking about, brought about by the familial relationship.

I think every Bingo manager should think twice about allowing family members and close friends to play Bingo at the halls they manage as it does tend to create bad feelings for players who often think something suspicious or "insider" is going on.

Bingo is a gaming competition where money is involved, and as such, tensions may sometimes run high. The last thing a Bingo hall manager should want to do is fuel that tension with suspicion. — *Guy*

#### **Employee Play**

#### Dear Aunt Bingo,

Some Bingo players feel it is not fair for employees of a Bingo hall to play Bingo at the hall they are employed at. Most employees of a Bingo hall are Bingo players who enjoy playing at their favorite hall and want to work part-time. Would it really be fair to tell them they cannot play Bingo there because they work there one or two days a week? Do grocery stores or department stores or any business tell their employees they cannot shop there because that is where they are employed? Do bowling alleys or golf courses tell employees they cannot play there?

Employees of a Bingo hall do have other jobs and their money is just as good as anyone else's. They purchase their paper just like anyone else from the same stack and series of papers as the rest of the players.

Bingo players who feel employees should not be playing are the same players who sit there and say things like: "Look at that lady; she always wins here!" or "That person over there has won three times tonight!" These jealous Bingo players will never be happy playing at any Bingo hall; and if they do feel a Bingo hall is cheating,

why would they want to play there and support them?

I don't think it's fair to ban employees from playing Bingo on their days off. Bingo is and should be for everyone! — **BT, Nampa, Idaho** 

#### Dear BT,

The service a Bingo hall provides is a game of chance, which makes it a bit different than a grocery store because tensions tend to run high when prize money is on the line, as opposed to just spending money to get groceries (though with current grocery prices this may not always hold true). While depriving workers and their family members the opportunity to play seems unfair, the suspicions that arise among players may actually hurt the hall in terms of attendance over time. It's a good question to throw out to our readers: are players' suspicions a sufficient reason for a manager to rethink this policy? #### **Vision Care**

#### **Dear Savvy Senior,**

What all does Medicare cover when it comes to vision care? I currently have good vision insurance through my employer but will lose it when I retire. — Almost 65

#### Dear Almost,

Many soon-to-be retirees are a bit blurry with what Medicare does and doesn't cover when it comes to vision care. The good news is that Medicare covers most medical issues like cataract surgery, treatment of eye diseases and medical emergencies. But unfortunately, routine care like eye exams and eyeglasses are usually the beneficiary's responsibility. Here's a breakdown of what is and isn't covered.

Eye exams and treatments: Medicare does not cover routine eye exams that test for eyeglasses or contact lenses, but they do cover yearly medical eye exams if you have diabetes or are at high risk for glaucoma. They will also pay for exams to test and treat medical eye diseases if you're having vision problems that indicate a serious eye problem like macular degeneration, dry eye syndrome, glaucoma, eye infections or if you get something in your eye.

Eye surgeries: Medicare will cover most eye surgeries that help repair the eye function, including cataract surgery to remove cataracts and insert

standard intraocular lenses to replace your own. Medicare will not, however, pick up the extra cost if you choose a premium multifocal lens that restores full range of vision, thereby reducing your need for glasses after cataract surgery. The extra cost for a premium lens can run \$1,500 to \$4,000 per eye.

Eye surgeries that are usually not covered by Medicare include refractive (LASIK) surgery and cosmetic eye surgery that are not considered medically necessary.

Eyeglasses and contact lenses: Medicare will not pay for eyeglasses or contact lenses, with one exception: If you have had a conventional intraocular lens inserted during cataract surgery, Medicare will pay for eyeglasses or contact lenses following the operation.

#### **WAYS TO SAVE**

Although original Medicare's vision coverage is limited to medical issues, there are ways you can save on routine care. Here are several to check into.

Medicare Advantage plans: Many of these plans, which are alternatives to original Medicare and sold through private insurance companies, cover routine eye exams and eyeglasses, but coverage is limited so be sure you understand the specifics. While I don't recommend enrolling in an Advantage plan just to get vision coverage it is an option you should know about. To locate Advantage plans in your area that provide vision coverage, go to Medicare.gov/plan-compare or call 800-633-4227.

Purchase vision insurance: If you get routine eye exams and purchase new eyeglasses annually, a vision insurance plan may be worth the costs. These policies typically range between \$5 and \$30 per month. Most plans will also have copays or deductibles you'll be responsible for.

Check veterans' benefits: If you're a veteran and qualify for VA health care benefits, you may be able to get some or all of your routine vision care through VA. Go to VA.gov/health-care/ about-va-health-benefits/vision-care to learn more.

#### Find cheaper shopping options:

Many retailers provide discountsbetween 10 and 50 percent-on eye exams and eyeglasses if you belong to a membership group like AARP or AAA. You can also save by shopping at discount retailers like Costco Optical, Sam's Club Optical or Target Optical, which are all recommended by Consumer Reports. Or consider buying your glasses online at retailers like: ZenniOptical.com, EyeBuyDirect.com or GlassesUSA.com which offer big savings. To purchase glasses online, you'll need a valid prescription from an eye doctor (no more than a year old), plus your pupillary distance number, which is the distance, measured in millimeters, between the centers of your pupils in each eye.

Look for assistance: There are also health centers and local clinics that provide free or discounted vision exams and eyeglasses to those in need. To find them put a call into your local Lions Club for referrals.



#### **Was This Call** on the River a Bit too **Optimistic?**

In a recent \$3.500 buy-in tournament at the 200/400/400 level, I raised to 1,000 out of my 50,000 stack with the QdJd in the cutoff. Both of the blinds called, the flop fell Kc10c4c, and my opponents checked to me.

In a multi-way pot, it is somewhat likely that someone has a hand they will not fold, like a pair or a flush draw. While you normally want to bet with your decent draws, it is simply too likely someone will call, so I decided to check.

The turn was the Qs and again my opponents checked to me. At this point, when most recreational live players check, I should have the best hand a decent amount of the time. I do not want to allow a club or jack to come on the river that could easily give one of my opponents the best

I bet 1,500 into the 3,400 pot. Looking back, I think a slightly larger bet of around 2,000 would have been better because it would induce my opponents to fold their junky draws that have a lot of equity, such as 9c7s.

Only the small blind, a loose, splashy recreational player, called. The river was the 6c, putting four clubs on the board. To my surprise, the small blind bet 3,500 into the 6,400 pot. This should be a trivially easy fold because I lose to any flush and any pair better than my middle pair, but it is important to think about how my range appears to my opponent.

When I checked behind on the flop, my opponent should assume that I do not have the Ac. If I do not have the nuts, that drastically decreases the number of hands I can easily call with on the river. I made the assumption that my opponent would bet with the Ac on the turn once the flop checked through. I was also not sure if he would value bet with either the Qc or Jc on the river.

You will find that most players will not value bet with marginal flushes in this spot because they will typically only get called when they are beat. Of course, my opponent could be turning a hand better than mine, such as Kd9d, into a bluff. The idea that neither of us has the nut flush made me think that my opponent should be bluffing much more often than normal, hoping to put me in a tough spot with either a weak flush or a one-pair hand.

Given my pot odds, which dictate that I need to have the best hand 25% of the time or more to profit, I decided to call. I am unsure exactly how often I have the best hand, but I thought I would win more than 25% of the time. Luckily for me, my opponent turned over the Js10s for a bluff, awarding me a nice pot.




