3. Oleg Cassini

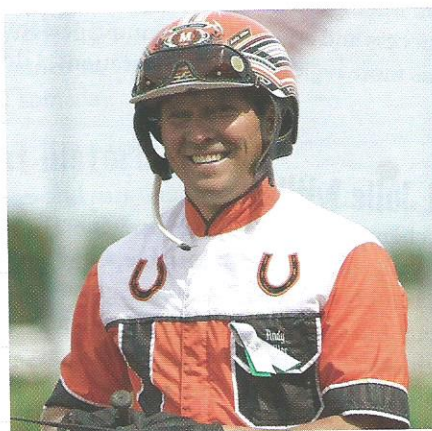

1. Daryl Bier

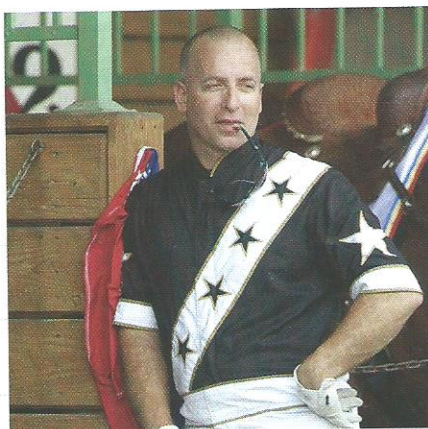
