The Warren Township District No. 4 School (Bunert School) was selected to receive the 2009 award because it represents noteworthy historical significance within the City of Warren.

The school was built in late 1875 and was named for August and Mine Bunert who sold their land to the school system so the Warren School District No. 4 school could be built on it.¹ At the time of its closing in 1944, the school became the longest serving one-room school in Warren.² The building was donated to the Warren Historical Society in 1987 and eventually moved to its current location on the grounds of Warren Tower High School.³ Through many generous donations, the school was restored and now serves as a museum for the Warren Historical and Genealogical Society.

The building was placed on the Michigan Register of Historic places in 1992.
