The Uniqueness of Jesus

There is an interesting exchange between the disciples
of John the Baptist and Jesus. It is found in:

Luke 7:18-23

18 The disciples of John reported all these things to him. And John, 19 calling two of his disciples to him, sent them to the Lord, saying, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" 20 And when the men had come to him, they said, "John the Baptist has sent us to you, saying, 'Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?'" 21 In that hour he healed many people of diseases and plagues and evil spirits, and on many who were blind he bestowed sight. 22 And he answered them, "Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, the poor have good news preached to them. 23 And blessed is the one who is not offended by me."

John the Baptist, was the forerunner for Jesus. His role was to prepare Israel for Jesus' arrival. He had been preaching a simple message "Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand." John was baptizing people for the purpose of identifying them with repentance and preparation for the Kingdom of God.

When Jesus comes along, John says that *Jesus is the "lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world."* – **John 1:29**. If we go back and read Luke chapters four through seven we see that the word that Jesus preaches is backed up by the wonders He performs. Jesus demonstrates his power over demons, sickness, leprosy, paralysis, over the Sabbath, and over death. John's disciples tell him all that Jesus is doing. They want to know if he is the Messiah.

Jesus makes this claim Himself in **Luke 7:18-23, John 8:28, John 13:17**. Yet there were some who did not believe, even Jesus own family – until the resurrection. No other faith can make this claim. We serve a risen Savior.

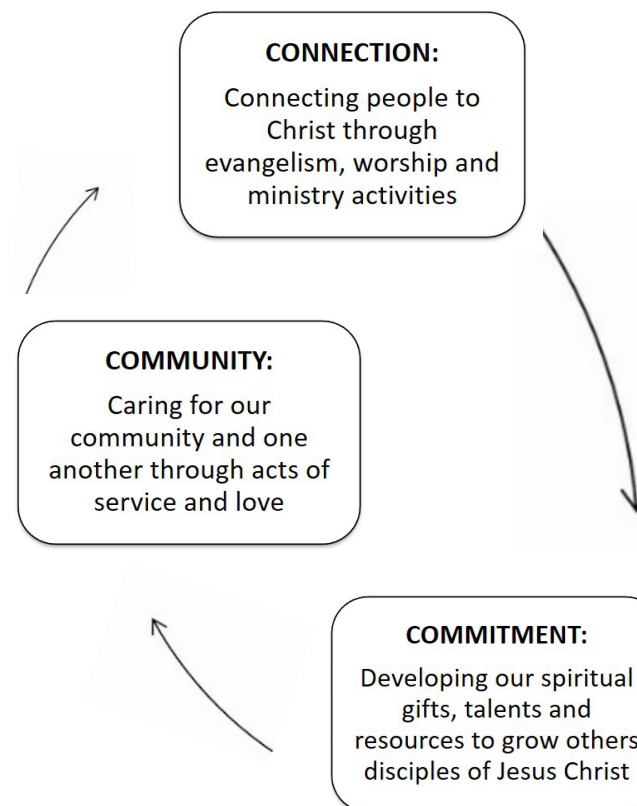
