# Return to the Sanctuary

Hybrid In-Person/Zoom Worship Begins June 6

After 63 weeks of worship by Zoom (including a few outdoor inperson/Zoom hybrid services), we will return to the sanctuary this Sunday, June 6. This is an exciting step forward, and we are looking forward to being together in the sanctuary again.

Over this past year, we have learned a lot and grown a lot. Worship via Zoom has worked very well, and it has been wonderful to have friends and family from many places join us each week. It has also been good to have folks here in Ames who would not otherwise be able to make it in person join us online. We will be continuing with Zoom as we gather in the building, so we will be doing "hybrid" services. Just as has been the case over the past year, we will figure it out as we go and have an "experimental" mindset about the way we do worship going forward.

If you plan to be here in person this Sunday, please <u>send an email</u> or call the church office at 515-292-9612 to let us know. This is not a reservation *per se*, but knowing how many to expect will help us as we get ready.

Beyond that, here are some things to know for when we first meet in the sanctuary:

- We will wear masks and practice social distancing. Every other row will be roped off; individuals/households are asked to sit 6 feet away from others on the same pew.
- You will find freestanding automatic hand sanitizer dispensers at the front and back entrances to the sanctuary.
- We will be able to sing with masks on. The choir will not sing in the sanctuary at this point. We hope to have more outdoor services over the summer in which the choir will sing.
- The front door (back of sanctuary) and some windows will be open and overhead fans running to increase ventilation.
- To minimize time together inside, plan to arrive no more than 10 minutes before the service. Worship will be much like our services have been over the past year (shorter than pre-pandemic in-person services).

- There will be opportunity to visit outside following worship; Fellowship Time will be outside for the month of June.
- Ushers will not distribute bulletins or collect the offering. We will continue (at least until we hire a new Office Manager) with the simple-to-print-off, one page bulletins, with printed copies available at church and electronic copies sent on Saturdays (as has been our practice these past months). There will be offering plates at the front and back of the sanctuary for you to drop your offering in as you leave.
- Nursery care will not be provided at this time.
- We will have communion this Sunday, as we generally do the first Sunday of each month. You may pick up a pre-packaged wafer/juice kit as you enter the sanctuary. If you prefer, you may bring your own communion elements.

We will continue to make adaptations and no doubt change some of these practices as the summer goes on. But I am so thankful that through all of the changes and challenges of this past year, we have been held together by God's grace and we are continuing to move forward. This is a hopeful time.

In our Move Forward Conversations held on May 16, twenty-one individuals—a fairly representative sample of our church—shared what they had experienced and learned over this past year. One of the things that came through loud and clear was that in a year filled will loss and pain, our church was a lifeline for a lot of people and carried out an important ministry in Ames and beyond. Those who took part had learned about the resilience of our church and the depth of concern and generosity expressed both in supporting our church's ministry and in reaching out to our neighbors in need. Over this past year, we also discovered needs in our community that we hope to address, working with other churches and non-profit groups through AMOS.

I am so thankful to serve as your pastor and I look forward to this next step of our journey together, as God leads us. And I look forward to seeing you this Sunday—in person or on Zoom!
