If you've benefitted from Medicare as I have, you know it's your best friend. From doctor visits to hospital stays and medications, Medicare has been there for me, as it has for many of you.

A little history may be necessary. Medicare was signed into law on July 30, 1965, by President Johnson as part of his "Great Society" legislative program after 20 years of Congressional debate. Congressional Republicans and the American Medical Association decried it as "socialism". Even then, commentator Ronald

Reagan said such a program would cause Americans to lose their "Freedoms"! One pamphlet read, "Would socialized medicine lead to socialization of other phases of life? Lenin thought so."

Medicare today is very popular, and it's more efficient financially than private insurance with administrative overhead at about 2-3%. It's helped seniors stay healthy and out of poverty due to high medical bills.

Yet, even with its success and popularity, it, and social security, has its detractors. Witness the recent comments heard by contenders for the Presidency:

"Medicare needs to be phased out."

"Raise the age eligible for all entitlements."

"Means testing is needed."

"Social security should be stopped after retirement income hits \$200,000."

Overstuffed Mail Boxes - a Sign of Fall

October is a busy month - especially for retirees with checking out the house for the cold weather to come, switching clothes to those warm ones, and, this year, finding the RC 7 ice scraper for the unexpected crusted windshield on October 18th.

But there are many other items you need to do or remember this fall! An important one is to find and save your letter of creditability including the post mark from your district stating that your drug coverage "is equal to or better than" original Medicare's drug coverage. This evidence could save you from penalties for not having coverage, and those costs would be added to your monthly bill **for the rest of your life!** This "letter" may be in the form of a post card, newsletter article, or other notice from your insurer crammed into your mailbox.

Because October 15 – December 7 is the yearly open enrollment period for Medicare, your mailbox will be bombarded by ads from dozens of insurance companies telling how they can save you money if you enroll in their Advantage plan. But beware! Health insurance is a very complex undertaking these days and remember if you leave your district coverage, you will not be allowed to get that coverage later even if you find out that you made a mistake.

But help and advice is available from several sources, and, as we and our friends age, we should take advantage of these valuable resources for information. And if you are about to become Medicare eligible, it is a must!

Here are two fine sources to check out:

- ➤ MEDICARE COUNSELOR HOTLINE <u>1-800-333-4114</u> daily 9 5 pm. NYSUT has contacted with the Medicare Rights Center to provide members with this service.
- ➤ NYSUT's Social Services Department of Member Benefits which can help with counseling and referrals and health care and personal problems.

And of course these are free services to NYSUT Members.


