VILLAGE OF PARDEEVILLE PARDEEVILLE VILLAGE BOARD MINUTES Village Hall – 114 Lake Street, Pardeeville Tuesday, December 12, 2023, at 7:00 p.m.

Call to Order – Haynes called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Roll Call – All trustee members were present, except Taylor who was absent with notice. Trustee Griepentrog attended via phone. Also present were Denise Vater, Clerk/Treasurer, Lieutenant Jordan Haueter, Robert Roth-RPS, Brittany Glancer, Jessica Cummings, Matt Baasch, Valerie Mendrala and Tom Romaniak.

Verification of posting of Agenda – Vater stated the agenda was posted in all 3 public places, as well as the Village website.

Pledge of Allegiance – Haynes led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Agenda Approval – Motion to approve the agenda Pufahl/Henslin. Motion carries unanimously. V.B. Minutes Approval Motion to approve the agenda Babcock/Englemann. No discussion. Motion carries unanimously.

Comments from the Floor

Tom Romaniak, Financial Advisor with Edwards Jones in Pardeeville, stated they have been located across from Kwik Trip for over 20 years and are looking for new space. The old Remington House property, the Senior Center, was something of interest to them. They are interested in renting space from the village for a portion of the east wing if the board would be interested in it.

Their current space is approximately 1300-1400 square foot and they would like to have approximately 1200 square feet or five rooms. He advised they would be interested in the four rooms that face the parking lot and 1 room that faces the bathroom area. Babcock spoke he would like to see them in the four rooms on the south/back side and one on the front to allow for potential business from the parking lot, possibly adding individual doors. Griepentrog asked about the lease where they currently are and Romaniak stated it is a year-to-year lease and their current lease is up at the end of June.

Brittany Glancer and Jessica Cummings spoke about wanting to open up an after-school program for Elementary students, age 4K-5th grade at the Senior Center. They would offer before and after school care, along with a 3 week summer school. They advised they would like to offer a safe place where children can go before and after school as a lot of kids don't have that. Pufahl asked how much space they would be interested in and they advised ideally the whole east wing.

Englemann asked about a plan regarding a plowing schedule in the Village. Babcock advised Englemann to be in contact with Dave, the Interim Public Works Director, and that wasn't something the board needed to get involved in. Griepentrog stated it was something to keep the crews involved and that a set schedule won't work.

Englemann asked if there was any update on the digger truck. Haynes stated he hasn't heard any updates from the attorney. He has the full contract and the only out would be if they are in violation of the contract. We have not signed the most recent change order, #4. The first three of which we never saw. They had a deadline, however we never signed it and Attorney Johonson will have to tell us how to proceed.

Communications & Reports

Angie Cox Library Report – No report, they're not meeting in December

EMS Commission Report – Abrath absent. Haynes stated Abrath had informed him about concerns that were reported to us previously about billing are being corrected and updated and he's confident now they are on their way back to health. **Pardeeville Fire District Report** – No report

PLMD Report - No report

Columbia County Supervisors Report – Review in packet.

Sheriff Monthly Report – Lt. Jordan Haueter asked if there were any questions. Englemann stated there were 9 hours of overtime. Haueter advised they try to keep the village staffed on Fridays/Saturdays. If someone is on vacation, training, etc. there is backfill so there's credit for the benefit time and the hours that we backfill.

There was a question regarding snow emergencies and Haueter asked how we notify the residents to enforce the no parking. He was advised by the Village Website and Madison Media. Haueter stated the ordinance states it has to be posted or it can't be enforced.

Brock and Vater will clarify. Vater will double check the ordinance and be in contact with Chase Brock about snow emergencies to clarify.

Babcock looked up the ordinance and stated Ordinance 32-155 states a snow emergency exists when the National Weather Service forecasts the depth of snow reaching an amount of three inches or more during any period of 24 hours or less.

Haueter stated interdictions were done on November 24-25, 2023, which yielded one impaired driver and several drug related stops, including with Methamphetamine.

Committee Minutes Review – Approved at the committee level. No motion needed.

OLD BUSINESS:

Update on Sunrise Subdivision

Haynes stated the progress that has been made is tremendous, approximately a year ahead. Lynn Holdings hired Robert Roth to begin developing the PUD for Lots 17, 18, 19. Pufahl asked clarification on what a PUD is. A PUD is a Planned Unit Development – normal zoning, different districts, zoning, setbacks, etc. Roth advised a PUD allows you to vary from those strict zoning standards. Lot 19 is set up well to do something like that. Lots 17 & 18 lack the depth and will have more traditional driveways.

There would be a General/Final Implication Plan, preliminary plat, final plat, zoning description that we'd be writing with the developer and then a developer's agreement for specific lots. If that requires an amendment it may be a developers agreement amendment. Babcock stated he believes the current developers agreement excludes lots 17, 18, 19. If Lynn Holdings wishes to proceed with PUD, they would need to come to an agreement on ownership with the Village of Pardeeville.

There may be discussions where Lynn Holdings might hire the contractor to complete the road and we reimburse.

Senior Center

Babcock stated the flooring for the atrium, the main area, has been removed. We got moved up on Canales Flooring's schedule. The flooring may be in by Christmas. The countertop company that we partnered with is no longer our partner and we have a new partner. They're hoping by next week or the week after. Haynes and Babcock removed the countertops to access plumbing. The plumber will be brought in to replace some dripping. The 10 year old dishwasher was removed and was in nice, clean working condition. Babcock asked if we would want to put the old dishwasher and refrigerator back in or spend some money and replace them. He did note the refrigerator doesn't have a handle on it. The stove is in good working order, stainless steel. Mrs. Lynch from the ADRC/Columbia County has specific requirements for their dishwasher for cleansing to be up to code. The County would be willing to purchase those two items or possibly reimburse the village as part of some funding they have available. However, if we rented out the facility to another group they could potentially be using those items. Haynes stated he would be willing to work with the ADRC. We'll replace it if something happens with other groups.

President Haynes asked Englemann if she had an update on any possible grants for Senior Center remodel. Englemann was asked to look into possible grants with the Senior Center. Haynes reported that our fundraising efforts are now over \$10,000 and we just received a \$5,000 gift. Haynes stated he is also applying for a \$15,000-\$25,000 local grant. The newly formed Pardeeville Area Community Enhancement (PACE) Fund has a couple donations that came in to them that will come back to us for the Senior Center.

Babcock asked Vater to be in contact with Magnussen about if the streets department will be plowing and maintaining the lot at that facility. It was discussed the front area should be plowed for contractors coming in, along with the garage. **West Wing Design State Plans – Roth Professional Services, Rob Roth**

Roth spoke about the canopy at the new, second entrance. The seamless steel roof was replaced a year or two ago. In order to install a second canopy over that second entrance it would require peeling back some of that seamless roof, which will be quite costly.

Roth suggested we still have a canopy, but it's a standalone concrete footings and deck, exposed, open construction that would be appealing appearance wise. He said it could be wrapped in white soffit so it would match with the existing. The intent is to provide protection during weather events. This facility is a senior center. Anything we can do to make the facility safer for people with limitations.

Griepentrog asked if once square footage is added if we'll be over square footage and if fire protection still needs to be maintained.

Roth Roth presented information regarding state codes.

Roth stated with the current construction and collection of that assembly it doesn't get it into another class. It could be approved at the state without a sprinkler system and still maintain senior facility. The amount of occupant load by the number of people in that building which can be housed is close to the limit with the sprinkler code, which is a key challenge with this project. A building with a wide area around it to utilize exemptions that afford it a 9,780 square foot instead of a 6,000 square foot. We're not changing drywall, walls, ceiling, we're simply remodeling and changing the use. Cutting off occupancy on the east side at this time.

Roth stated the site will need more parking, under our own ordinance.

Babcock made a motion for RPS to proceed with the state permitting process for the repurposing of the Pardeeville Senior Center. Second by Englemann. Any further discussion on senior center plans being submitted. None.

Roll call vote – Englemann – Y, Griepentrog – Y, Haynes – Y, Henslin – Y, Pufahl – Y, Taylor – Absent. Motion carries.

Dam Project – Roth Professional Services

The embankment wall is tilting in towards the lake and needs repair. Roth stated he's worked with the DNR and obtained a grant about a year ago. He just recently received the verbal approval from the DNR. He told them to hold off sending a letter as under the grant the village has 90 days to submit a bidding process.

Roth asked if we can get the bidding going and talk about the completion dates.

Haynes suggested possibly working with our new Public Works Director if they can write the RFP instead of relying on an engineering service. It would then be reviewed by both Roth and our lawyer.

Roth Roth also discussed alternate options to the Dam Project.

Englemann asked if there would be a benefit to removing the concrete. Roth stated if the water does breathe, it would then flow over, ignoring the spillway. There would be nonconformities that would create erosions. That's why the base bid has it left in there.

Roth was advised to proceed with a bid on this. They'll issue the approval letter once he gets back to them. Babcock asked if we should hold off until late January/early February. Roth stated the bidding should be done before March.

Englemann would like to make a motion to start the bidding process now.

Pufahl would like to hold off until we have a Public Works Director hired.

RPS is handling the bid documents, we're handling the publication. If the village wishes to explore options with DPW we could. We'll get the bid set up for the board meeting in March. It would need to happen right away. **Babcock will second the motion.**

Henslin asked if Roth would be working with the interim Public Works Director. He stated yes, Magnussen would get involved now and have some background. When the new hire starts Roth and Magnussen would get him up to speed.

Roth stated for the pre-bid meeting we would have village representation there. For the posting and publishing requirements they would need to be in contact with the clerk's office.

Motion is on the floor with a second. All in favor say aye. All in favor. None opposed. Motion carries.

Lake Street 2029 – Joe DeYoung MSA

Haynes spoke about the state having a project for Highway 44 from Main Street to Schwanz. Our responsibility on this and our estimates is fairly minimal. Our commitment would be \$104,000 to get the whole stretch taken care of. It does not appear there needs to be much done in sanitary, water and sewer, just storm drain work.

If we commit to this for 2029 the total estimated cost is \$1,900,000. We would only be paying \$104,000. The numbers would change over the next 6 years, however the ratio will not change.

Babcock made a motion that the Village of Pardeeville be represented by the Village President and they are authorized to sign the state municipal financial agreement for the designated project. Second by Griepentrog.

Any discussion. Pufahl said he hates roundabouts. Englemann agrees.

The board discussed ways to designate funds for future projects and equipment.

We discussed the West Chestnut Street project and how to proceed in budget for that.

NEW BUSINESS:

Approval of 2024-2025 election workers

Vater spoke about the list of current 2024/2025 election inspectors. Pufahl made a motion to approve the election inspectors. Englemann seconded. Motion carries.

Purchasing Policy

Babcock spoke about the Village moving in to a position to do purchase orders. We'll be able to check off how much was ordered. We've been asking for a paper trail and Interim DPW Director Magnussen put this purchasing policy together. The Finance & Personnel committee reviewed this and make a recommendation to adopt this purchasing policy. Motion made by Babcock. Seconded by Pufahl.

Englemann asked what happens if in the future we have a president who doesn't oversee finances. The president currently can make an authorization from \$5,000-10,000. If the source of funding is in the budget and the budget has been approved. DPW and Clerk can approve it without coming back for a second referral, unless it is a capital project.

All types of decisions as part of the Emergency Management Planning committee and management the Village President has authorization for. An example of an emergency would be when the dam washed out in 2008.

Englemann suggested to remove the purchase authorization amount of \$5,000-\$10,000 and change it to anything over \$5,001 would need to go to the board. That way it's not giving permission to go above and beyond to do a change order without board approval.

Babcock stated any change order greater than "X" needs to be reviewed by the Finance Committee. Henslin advised a percentage of the budgeted amount, such as if it exceeds 2% of the budget.

It was asked if it would prohibit the Village from doing their job without constantly coming back to the board. Haynes stated if it was approved within the original budgeted amount, it's approval by the Village Board.

Pufahl is withdrawing second. Babcock is withdrawing his motion. No motion on the floor.

Babcock makes a motion to refer this back to the interim DPW director to revisit the purchase authorization amounts in harmony with Clerk/Treasurer.

Babcock asked if we wanted to add a paragraph in regards to change orders being greater than a percentage/dollar amount that it will be reviewed by the Finance Committee.

Englemann seconded sending it back to be reviewed. Motion carries unanimously. Taylor absent.

Haynes entertained a motion that this board wants a purchasing policy in place by our January 9th meeting. Englemann seconded.

Street Department Hiring

Babcock stated there is a street department position coming open on January 2nd due to a retirement. The Finance Committee recommends that the range for hiring of this position be at a range of \$24-28.

Motion by Babcock, Second by Pufahl. Any discussion.

Englemann asked if we are going to require the new hire to already have a CDL. It was advised that it must be obtained within six months, however we don't need to pay for it. The new Public Works Director should be involved in the hiring so Vater will get the position posted before December 25th and will have the deadline for applications be January 12th so the applications are ready to be scheduled once the new director starts January 15, 2024.

Time of posting. New DPW to be involved in hiring so after the 15th of January.

Approval of Bills

Vater advised in the future the library purchases would be listed separately from other bills.

Griepentrog asked about check #38089 to Pieper Electric for \$37,493 and check #38278. The response was that it was for the waste water treatment plant generator. We budgeted for one and received three.

Englemann asked about check #38072 to the Columbia County Humane Society since we no longer use them. The Humane Society bills the year following and this was for billing September-November 2022. We should be getting one more bill from them for 2023.

Pufahl made a motion to approve the bills, Henslin seconded.

Roll call vote – Haynes – Y, Henslin – Y, Pufahl – Y, Taylor – Absent, Babcock – Y, Griepentrog – Y, Englemann – Y. Motion carries.

CLOSED SESSION under WI Stats. Sec. 19.85 (1) (c) for considering employment, compensation, or performance evaluation data of any public employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction or exercises responsibility.

Babcock read the Board into closed session. Motion by Babcock to go into closed session at 8:55 PM. Second by Pufahl.

Roll call vote – Henslin – Y, Pufahl – Y, Taylor – Absent, Babcock – Y, Griepentrog – Y, Englemann – Y, Haynes – Y

RETURN TO OPEN SESSION to formally dispose of any issues discussed in closed session.

Motion to return to open session at 9:34 pm by Pufahl, seconded by Griepentrog.

Babcock makes a motion to extend offer of employment to Craig Abegglen, \$22.50/hour with an option of declining insurance for an additional \$2/hour, starting at 3 weeks vacation and a review after six months. Second by Englemann. Start date should be January 3rd, 2024. Any further discussion. None. Motion carries unanimously. Taylor absent.

Englemann made a motion to hire Austen Frederickson at \$81,000/year salary at an increase to \$85,000 not accepting insurance and be awarded 3 weeks vacation to start. For three months he will work 10+ hour days, four days a week to attend to his family in Brillion.

Motion was amended to review his hours at three months with his potential start date being January 15, 2024. Second by Henslin. No further discussion. Motion carries unanimously. Taylor absent.



SECTION V. WHEREAS, appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the State and available for work in the County under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

• The Death Investigation determined the decedent succumbed to natural causes on top of alcoholism.

• The two Domestics were from the same residence and resulted in arrests each time.

• The Fraud call was for a counterfeit \$20.00 deposited at a local bank.

• The Juvenile calls ranged from two at the middle school, One for siblings arguing, one at Kwik Trip for a juvenile not wanting to return home, and the last from a foster child not wanting to return home.

• The OWI resulted in an arrest for an impaired driver over three times the legal limit.

• There was a search warrant conducted in the village which resulted in drug possession and trafficking charges. Two arrests were made.

• The Welfare calls consisted of two from the High School, two from Kwik Trip and one in the village. All were investigated and unfounded.






