An accidental discovery by one of our caveman ancestors probably started archery in prehistoric times. For many thousands of years the bow and arrow was indispensable as a weapon and larder furnisher.

Every nation used the bow and arrows, and, as time progressed, developed its own type of tackle. During medieval times the backbone of the English armies were the archers. Wise kings, who realized the potency of these weapons, enacted laws so that their people had to practice shooting at long ranges on holidays and feast days. The result was that the English Yeoman with his six foot long bow and heavy, broad-headed war arrows was held in fearsome respect by the soldiery of Europe.

It is a matter of but a few decades since the bow and arrow was used very effectively against gun powder by the Chinese. There are still many primitive tribes that rely on their bows and arrows to supply them with game and fish. Using history as a measuring stick, it is only vesterday that the gun superseded bows and arrows.

As a sport it enjoyed an unusual revival in the United States during the 1870's and '80's. We grin a bit when we see old daguerreotypes of men in derbies, odd coats and peculiar trousers alongside of women in hoop skirts lined up in tournament array. Then, archery was a sport of the élite, now it is for everybody.

Our company may be regarded as the link between this revival and the present growth of interest in the sport.

Mr. William Stemmler, father of the present owner, made self and backed bows for the old Staten Island Archery Club and the Brooklyn Bowmen as far back as 1875. He was a survivor of the old revival and continued to love and use the bow until his death. L. E. Stemmler inherited the skill and enthusiasm which distinguished his father and, in 1912, organized the business under his name.

During the past fifteen years, individual archers and small groups, scattered all over the country, have enjoyed target shooting, roving, archery golf, and hunting. The National and Eastern Archery Associations are now flourishing and conduct annual tournaments. There is no section in the country but that holds a tournament each week-end within automobile distance of its enthusiasts.

The interest of Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Y.M.C.A., the camp movement and educational centers will insure the continued growth of the sport.

Archery is one of the few sports that permits active participation by old and young, while deep in every one is the instinct to pull a strong bow and watch the keen shaft fly. Archery is enshrined in the romantic tales of Robin Hood and of the days when Knighthood was in Flower. Stories of our own great West, of the covered wagon and of the Indian's prowess with the bow and arrow lent glamour and adventure to our childhood and will impart it to the youth of tomorrow.

Hunting laws, specifically mentioning bows and arrows, indicate how widely they are used for taking game. Many states have set aside forest preserves where hunting is permitted only with bows and arrows. The archer's implements are the true weapons of the real woodcrafter and conservationist. Deer and all manner of small game are constantly being taken by the archer. It is indeed a proud moment when you get your game with the bow and arrow. You know the quarry had every chance, and it was your own skill and strength of arm that won.



An Archer should also be a Craftsman. He should, at least, be able to make minor repairs to his gear. We strongly recommend that everyone seriously intending to make Archery his hobby, learn to make his own bows, arrows and accessories. There is genuine satisfaction in making

your own tackle. To see a shaft made by your own hands, speed from a bow fashioned on your own work bench, gives you a sound, honest bit of happiness.

In order to be of greater service to those who wish to make their own tackle, we have written "THE ESSEN-TIALS OF ARCHERY" ("How to Use and Make Bows and Arrows"). This new handbook contains over ninety

pages (6" x 9") of concise, practical, usable knowledge. Eight large photographs illustrate Bracing or Stringing a Bow, How to Shoot and Aim. A full page cut explains "Point of Aim" shooting.

Tables of measurements of finished bows of Lemonwood, Osage Orange (Bois d'arc), and Yew are given. Eleven full page plates show accessories, and picture, step by step, making Long Bows (plain ended, horn tipped, rawhide backed, self and joined yew and osage orange), Flat Bows, Reflexed Bows, Strings, Self and Footed Arrows. General information, a section on archery for clubs and camps, various archery rounds, tournament conduct, and a glossary of the language of the sport

### EQUIPMENT

One who shoots the bow and arrow is called an Archer. His equipment or tackle consists of:

### THE BOW

Nine tenths of all moderately priced, good bows are made of LEMONWOOD. For the beginner a LEMON-WOOD Bow is recommended. The Standard Long Bow is good to start with, but the Flat, Semi-Indian type Bow is becoming popular too. Later, you may want a fine

Men and grown boys take a 6'0" Long Bow. If you choose a Flat Bow, 5'6" to 5'8" is the proper length. Your bow should not be too strong. You should be able to pull and loose it without too much effort. Thirty-five to forty-five pounds pulling weight is sufficient. Grown girls and women take a 5'6" Long Bow or 5'3" Flat Bow. Weights (pull in pounds) of twenty to thirty-five pounds are enough. Juveniles take bows the same height as themselves, and with pulls of fifteen to twenty-five pounds.

### THE ARROW

Modestly priced arrows are recommended for beginners. Arrows are perishable, and while learning, it is best to use and abuse a low priced set. After you become more proficient, better, straighter arrows of imported Norway Pine or Port Orford Cedar are necessary. Footed Tournament Arrows are for the more advanced target shot. The arrows of the Field Archer or Rover are usually fletched with long, low, triangular turkey wing feathers and the heads are heavy steel piles or rounded roving heads. The Hunter's arrows, too, have long, low, rakish feathers and his shafts are headed with keen bladed hunting heads.

### THE ARMGUARD

It is a heavy leather guard for the left wrist and covers the inside of the left arm from the hand almost to the elbow. Its use is to protect the left wrist and forearm from the bow string's strike after the arrow is shot. A good Armguard is a very essential part of an archer's tackle.

### FINGER GUARDS

They are also very necessary. They protect the first three fingers of the right hand—the shooting fingers. Constant friction with the bow string causes soreness unless they are protected by a glove, padded on the first three fingers, semi-gloves or "tabs."

### THE OUIVER

A receptacle for conveniently carrying arrows. It is a long, narrow bag, in which arrows are placed. It has a belt for the waist, or a shoulder harness when worn on the back.

### THE TARGET

Archery targets, with the standard target rings of gold, red, blue, black and white come in various sizes-24", 30", 36" and 48". The scoring, beginning with the gold or center counts 9, 7, 5, 3 and 1. The tournament size is We make two kinds of targets; the regulation hand wound rye straw targets, and those made of rye straw covered with burlap.

### THE TASSEL

It is a worsted or woolen tassel and is used to wipe arrows clean when soiled or muddied after a shot. It is hung at the belt.



#### LEMONWOOD

is a tropical hardwood. It is close grained, heavy, tough and springy. Its color, from which it gets its name, is light yellow or lemon color. It is one of the three best Bow Woods, and the fact that the highest score ever made in tournament for the American Round, was made with a Lemonwood Bow, speaks well for its qualities.

### LONG BOW STAVES

are for making the "Long Bow"; which, as its name indicates, is a long bow. A six foot bow may be only one inch at the widest part and taper to as little as three eighths inches at the nocks. The cross section of the finished bow is an arch, slightly wider than high.

### FLAT BOW STAVES

are wider and shorter than Long Bow Staves. They usually are one and a half inches at the widest part. The cross section of a finished flat bow is wide and flat. Because Lemonwood is so straight grained, square bow staves for long bows and flat staves for flat bows may be sawn from the spars. Every possible precaution is taken to insure your getting good wood. No stave is sent out from which a good bow cannot be made, but as the maker is largely responsible for the finished bow, results are not guaranteed.

### ROUGHED OUT OR SEMI-FINISHED STAVES

Staves are roughed out on a planer or with a hand draw knife to the approximate dimensions of the finished bow. All the preliminary work is done and finishing your bow is an easier and simpler task. During this process, any stave that develops a flaw is rejected, so that when you buy a roughed out stave you are sure of getting an excellent piece of wood.

### BACKED BOW STAVES

We ordinarily back our staves with Clarified Rawhidea tough, transparent, parchment-like skin. This dries to a hard, horn-like layer of protection on the back of the bow. You may have your stave backed with Black,

Red or White Fibre, instead of rawhide, if you wish. These colored backs polish to a beautiful lustre and add beauty and finish to your bow.

### BLUE RIBBON CERTIFIED LEMONWOOD BOW STAVES

are the best that Nature grows. They have been selected very carefully, and are from mountain grown logs. It is only in the uplands that soil and climate combine to produce the finest Lemonwood. No lowland timber goes into these staves. Seasoning conditions are carefully regulated. The result of this care and special attention, from the spar to the stave, is wood of exceptional quality. If you want the best in Lemonwood Bow Staves, BLUE RIBBON CERTIFIED LEMONWOOD BOW STAVES will meet your requirements.

### ROYAL PURPLE PROCESSED LEMONWOOD **BOW STAVES**

For several years we have been experimenting with Lemonwood in order to improve it. We wanted it to make weapons that shot harder and faster, that looked more beautiful and that lasted longer. We feel confident we have attained this result with our Royal Purple Staves. These staves are selected, roughed out and processed in a chemical bath. During the processing the staves turn a rich purple color, and, when worked up, the back of the bow is a beautiful, rich, wine shade. The belly will be streaked or mottled.

### FACED LEMONWOOD BOW STAVES

"Facing" a bow is a new technique in the art of bow making. It has long been known that a laminated bow shoots harder than a bow of a single piece of wood. We take Blue Ribbon Lemonwood staves and tiller them so they bend properly, as they should in the finished bow. Then we apply a strip of Royal Purple Lemonwood, Acana or Golden Osage to the belly side of the stave. These woods are noted for cast. Instead of using glue, the laminating is done with a PLASTIC, a new, scientific way of joining woods, and the result is an exceedingly strong, water-proof joint that will not let go.

Practically all preliminary work is done, and finishing your bow is an easier and simpler task. They have the handle inlay or riser joined in place with a PLASTIC and are band-sawn for handle shape. Backed Bow Staves are backed with clarified rawhide—a tough, transparent, parchment-like skin. ( Note: All handle risers on flat staves are joined with a PLASTIC, which makes an exceptionally strong. waterproof job.)

### "FACED," FLAT LIMBED, LEMONWOOD BOW STAVES

These laminated staves are tillered, the notches are cut and the handle riser is shaped. All that is necessary to finish them into beautiful Flat Bows is to scrape, sandpaper, varnish or lacquer, and put on the handle and string. All laminating is done with a PLASTIC.

# OJAGE ORANGE BOW JIAVE

OSAGE ORANGE is America's gift to archers. It is a golden yellow hardwood that darkens to rich brown. It makes hard shooting, tough, sturdy bows that will stand lots of abuse. Osage is a favorite for Hunting and Roving Bows, and, in many opinions, it is the best all around bow wood. Osage Orange is also known as Bois d'arc (Bodark) and was much used by the Indians in the South and Middle West. The early French explorers gave it its name. Because of its knottiness, there is more Osage available for short staves or billets. It is the safest wood for very heavy tackle-bows of sixty pounds pull

OSAGE ORANGE STAVES for Long Bows are roughly  $1\frac{1}{2}$  wide, and will make bows with pulls up to 75 pounds. FLAT OSAGE STAVES are  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " to 2" wide with plenty of wood for the heaviest tackle. BILLETS are approximately 1½" wide and are intended for splicing under the handle. BACKED STAVES are backed with Clarified Rawhide or Hickory. ROUGHED OUT or SEMI-FINISHED STAVES are hand worked to the approximate shape of the bow and finishing is simplified and made easier. OSAGE STAVES are not straight. Since they are cut right from the log, all peculiarities of the growing tree appear, and whatever dips or risers appear are followed so the grain may run from tip to tip. Every stave we send out will make a beautiful bow, but no exchanges or claims of any kind will be allowed if work has been done on them.

### YEW BOW STAVES

YEW WOOD is relatively soft. The heartwood is reddish brown, and the sapwood is creamy white. This contrast in the finished bow is a great part of its beauty. Yew Staves may come with minor defects, such as small knots, pins, curls or dips. It takes a skilled craftsman to get the most out of yew staves. 



# ROUND ARROW SHAFTS:-

Since arrows are intended for different kinds of shooting, it is natural that they are made of woods that fill various needs. Birch is good for beginners' arrows, for field and hunting shafts. It is tough, hard and strong. Our birch is selected in the log; straight grained sections of fine Maine stock are picked and made up to our specifications. They are not to be compared with the ordinary run of the mill product. Birch target, field, roving and hunting arrows, even though they may not be as perfect as fine target arrows made of the soft woods, when fletched with long triangular feathers, whistle straight and true to the mark. Birch may be straightened with the fingers—a distinct advantage. Port Orford Cedar comes from the West Coast and is a fine, light wood with a delightful odor. It makes excellent self and footed arrows. Our Norway Pine (Pinus Sylvestris) is from the forests of Finland where the cold, stern climate makes for slow growth and splendid "spiney" wood. It is the old "red deal" of the Englis and there is no finer arrow wood than good Norway Pine. The different between really fine, straight shafts and others is so little, it pays you in satisf use to get the best. Port Orford Cedar





# FLAT LEMONWOOD BOWS: Plain Ends

THE AMERICAN FLAT BOW is a development of the past five years. Because it is wide and flat, it may be made shorter than a long bow and safely take the same length arrow. In other words, a 5'6" Flat Bow can take the same arrow length as a 6'0" long bow. Its shortness makes for sharp, fast action, and the narrow, high handle permits the arrow to pass nearer the center of the bow. Flat Bows are fast gaining in popularity. Men and grown boys take a 5'6" to 5'8" Flat Bow. You should be able to pull and loose your bow without too much effort, so 35 to 45 pounds is sufficient. Grown girls and women take a 5'3" or 5'6" Flat Bow. Pulls of 20 to 35 pounds are enough. Juveniles take bows the same height as themselves and with pulls of 15 to 25 pounds.

# LEMONWOOD LONG BOWA: Plain Ends

THE LONG BOW is the bow of song and story. Its traditional shape has come down through the ages. It is long and narrow, with rounded belly and flat back. Men take a 6'0" Standard Long Bow, with drawing pulls of from 35 to 45 pounds for ordinary shooting. Girls and women take a 5'6" Long Bow with pulls of from 20 to 35 pounds. Youngsters take bows the same height as themselves, and with pulls of 15 to 25 pounds. A bow should not be so strong that you cannot pull and loose the string with ease and comfort.

## How To Figure Parcel Post Charges

The shipping weight of each article is given. Add the pounds and ounces, and change the ounces into full pounds. For example—if the total weight of your order is 5 pounds 4 ounces, it will take the 6 pound rate. If you live in Illinois, which is zone 5, your postage would be 38 cents.

If there is any question about the postage you wish to be certain of, ask your postmaster.

## PLEASE NOTE BEFORE ORDERING

- 1. Be sure your name and address are plainly and legibly lettered.
- 2. Orders should be accompanied by remittance, otherwise they will be sent C.O.D. Postal money order is preferred.
- 3. C.O.D. orders result in extra expense to you. You are charged with a 12 cent service fee here and an extra charge of 6 cents at your end. If your C.O.D. order is over \$5.00 the total charges are about 28 cents. These charges go to the postal authorities. You save money by remitting with your order. C.O.D. shipments by express are subject to similar charges.
- 4. ALL ORDERS ARE F.O.B. QUEENS VILLAGE, L. I., N. Y. You pay the transportation charges. Information to enable you to figure parcel post costs is given in the catalog.
- 5. Parcel Post packages measuring over 84" are considered to be 10 pounds, whether they actually weigh

- that much or not. Therefore, the most efficient and safest way to ship orders of three or more 6' bow staves, targets, target stands and packages of several bows is by express collect.
- 6. Canadian Shipments: Inasmuch as no postal C.O.D. exists between the U.S. and Canada, all Canadian orders must be accompanied by full remittance and allowance for prepayment. Since 42 inches is the measurement limit, most shipments go by express. Duty on archery tackle into Canada is about 20% of the value.
- 7. To obviate confusion in filing, if you are connected with a school, camp, Y.M.C.A., Scout council or other institution, will you kindly always give both the name of the organization and your own. If you send in an order on a Scout Council letterhead, it would be filed under that council's name. Later you might write us about it using your name only and we would experience difficulty in locating the original order.
