City Code Guest, John Christophe, Re-enforces Reporting Code Violations



At our neighborhood meeting on November 28th, we had a long Q&A session with John Christophe from the City Code Department. We were able to directly communicate to Code some of the long-standing issues that have been ongoing in and around our neighborhood. Mr. Christophe told us about the **Top 5 Residential Code Violations:**

High grass and weeds; Work/construction without a permit; Accumulated trash and debris;

Unsanitary conditions; and damaged exterior walls.

The top Business Violations include broken windows, doors, chipped paint, and decayed wood.

The Code Dept.'s mission is to "provide fair and equitable enforcement of local property maintenance, land use, and nuisance codes in order to [keep] Austin safe and livable." They are not a police force that actively patrols neighborhoods looking for violations. Rather, it is largely up to citizens to report conditions that jeopardize the neighborhood's safety and livability. Mr. Christophe stressed that *you must report violations by calling 311 or through the Austin 311 smartphone app, and after having done so you can reach out to Code directly to follow up. Sidewalks in our Future



With all of the construction happening in Coronado Hills, a few neighbors have asked if we are going to see sidewalk construction in our near future. The short answer is: It's not happening soon but it will happen eventually.

According to the Austin Sidewalk Program Project Map there is no sidewalk construction planned for our neighborhood within the next six months. But the City of Austin Sidewalk

Master Plan does have sidewalk construction in our neighborhood categorized as "Medium" to "Very High Priority". This means that our neighborhood will be addressed sometime between 2018 and 2027 (that's right, twenty twenty-seven). We are categorized as a "Very High" priority in part because of our proximity to a public school (both Reagan and Clifton).

There's not a whole lot we can do in the near term to change the master plan because it was developed by the City completely separate from our Neighborhood Plan.
