When Your Voice Is Silent...

Genesis 40:13,23 ¹³ But remember me when it is well with you; please do me the kindness to make mention of me to Pharaoh, and so get me out of this place. ²³ Yet the chief cup bearer did not remember Joseph, but forgot him.

Joseph was a sincere and faithful man of God. His faith persisted through tough times and difficult circumstances. It is evident that he completely relied on the Lord, and followed the vision or voice of God bestowed upon him. However in prison, it seems that Joseph did something unusual; he asked the chief cup bearer for help. There is nothing wrong in asking for help, but up until this point, the Scripture explains that Joseph was a patient and loyal man to God. He was symbolized as the figure that absolutely was dependent on God's guidance and providence. However, in prison Joseph was desensitized to the voice of God, thus making him raise his voice and say, "please remember me," thus relying on man who seemed to have a better chance at helping him. Unfortunately the cup bearer forgot about Joseph for two years. His desperate begging was in vain and Joseph finally realized that he was not remembered. It made Joseph revisit his place of solitude and silence. Then God set off to work on his life again when he completely surrendered the possibility of hope that the cup bearer would ever remember him.

Living our life, God may be silent when your voice is loud. Instead of being patient and waiting for God's timing, your mind may rush with anguish and therefore plea for help from someone who has a better chance of providing it. But when you are in His plan, your own voice won't change the course God has set for you. Rather, it could only slow down God's timing. Set aside all of your expectations and hopes and wait quietly in faith for God. He understands your heartaches and hardships and knows what you need. He never forgets you and sets out to work on your life when your voice is silent.

Mother's Day and Teacher Recognition Sunday will be celebrated on May 8th.



From Doug Thomas:



One day in 1975, Reese Kauffmann, an Indianapolis manufacturer, responded to the invitation at the end of a missionary service. Reese was a believer but felt something was missing in his life. He needed an outlet to serve the Lord with all his heart. A man named Roy Daniels met Reese in the prayer room and asked what decision he'd reached. "I don't know that I've reached a decision," said Reese. "I've just realized I want to do something for God."
