
The origins of the Thanksgiving holiday in the United States are more complicated than most people think. Was the first Thanksgiving meal in Massachusetts, complete with buckled, wide-brimmed hats, in 1621? Or was it an English celebration on the shores of Virginia, in 1619? Or how about a Spanish gathering in what became Texas, in 1598 — or Florida, in 1565?

The reasons for those celebrations varied. The English colonists in Virginia, for example, declared the day a commemoration of their arrival, thanking God for safe passage across a forbidding ocean; likewise, the Spanish explorers thanked God for survival. On the other hand, after a 1637 massacre of Native Americans, the governor of Plymouth wrote that Thanksgiving Days would be "in honor of the bloody victory." In 1789, President George Washington declared a national Day of Thanksgiving to thank God for the birth of a new nation.

The holiday we inherit today and call Thanksgiving is complex. My question is, how will we celebrate Thanksgiving this year?

Here is a suggestion. Perhaps there is no better day than Thanksgiving to reflect on the power of gratitude to commit ourselves to cultivating it more intentionally in the coming year.

If we think of gratitude primarily as a kind of duty to do something such as write a "thank you" note, we are missing the boat entirely. Effectively, we reduce one of life's wonders to mere good manners. On the contrary, gratitude is a vital force in the world, an act that builds relationships, communities, and healthy human hearts.



I like what one of my favorite websites *The Salt Project* says about gratitude, "The science on this subject is overwhelming: in study after study, gratitude has been shown to lead to stronger relationships, better sleep, lower blood pressure, fewer trips to the doctor, fewer depressive symptoms, more patience, and more perseverance, among other benefits. In one particularly intriguing study, gratitude turns out to be a powerful antidote to the 'Headwinds/Tailwinds Asymmetry,' our all-too-common tendency to focus on the obstacles in our lives (headwinds) and overlook blessings (tailwinds), an imbalance that over time leads to feeling aggrieved and resentful. In short, focusing on headwinds breeds bitterness; focusing on tailwinds breeds appreciation — and the act of thanksgiving helps call our attention to the winds at our backs."

Gratitude is powerful — but how do we make more of it in our lives? It turns out that some of the most effective tools for increasing gratitude are also some of the simplest and most familiar. First, the basic act of not just counting our blessings but also recording them in a form we can revisit later — such as in a journal or notebook — has been shown to significantly enhance feelings of thankfulness over time.

Second, another simple action has been shown to be even more effective: writing a letter of thanks to a friend, family member, acquaintance, or even a stranger. That is right — thank you notes can change your life! Indeed, we should write the humble thank you note not merely as a way to inform others about how grateful we are, but also as a way to help strengthen how grateful we are in the first place.

A third practice isn't only effective, it is downright fun: connecting with a friend once a week for coffee, lunch, phone, online or a walk and intentionally devoting at least part of the conversation to sharing what we are thankful for these days. When it comes to gratitude, just saying it out loud to someone we like and respect is a powerful step toward noticing and experiencing the blessings in our lives.

The power of these practices makes sense. One of our most precious treasures is our time-and-attention and how we spend that treasure will directly determine the health of our hearts.

Prayer is a kind of spoken gratitude journal, an intimate thank you note or thankful conversation with God. And so is worship.

In the end, we are all "pilgrims" after all. Start a gratitude journal. Try writing a simple thank you note. Connect with a friend for coffee. Recommit to a practice of prayer. Let this year's Thanksgiving be not just a day of gratitude, but a springboard into a new life of gratitude.

A December to Remember ...

Let me take you back to 1974. Jim and I attended Christmas Day worship here at St. John's. That was our first Christmas together, as husband and wife, as we had only met in March of that year. Yes, I know that was a short engagement!

During the time prior to our marriage, I had been attending services here at St. John's with Jim and heard much about the history of the church. One of the stories was about the lightning strike in the summer of 1956, which resulted in a fire that destroyed the church building. He told me that the folks of St. John's worshipped in the parking lot that fateful Sunday morning and supported each other as they looked to the future of the church.

St. John's in their usual response to need rallied around each other and over the next several years, worshipped wherever they could find space. Finally, after a successful building project, there was a beautiful new church with a spacious sanctuary for worship.

On that Christmas Day in 1974, I saw all that history flash before me. Pastor Bebler was facing the congregation during the Communion service, when suddenly flames shot up as the Advent wreath on the altar caught fire. The congregation got pastor's attention, and pastor calmly picked up that wreath, carried it outside, and came back in to finish the worship service. All I could think of was, oh no...this is a disaster happening again for this church. Luckily, all that occurred was Pastor Bebler having some singed hairs, and a destroyed Advent wreath.

I will never forget my first Christmas Day here at St. John's, and how grateful I was that we all were spared a tragedy that morning. My prayers were of thanksgiving for everyone's safety, and that this beautiful church was not damaged.

As we celebrate Christmas, 2025, let us all have joy and gladness, and rejoice at the birth of our Savior.
