## SCHOOL BOARD NEWS

These are the UNOFFICIAL DRAFT MINUTES SUBJECT TO CHANGE AND BOARD APPROVAL, 2-6- 102,104 MCA of the Regular October 8, 2018 School Board meeting:

- Chairman Don Hagan called the meeting to order at 800 p.m. Roll was taken and it was established that a quorum was present.
- On motion by Matt Stentoft, seconded by Jesse Cole, the minutes from the regular meeting on September 10, 2018, were approved unanimously as presented.
- The Principal and Superintendent's reports were discussed and are attached and made a part of these minutes by reference.

### • Committee Reports:

**Buildings & Grounds:** Morgan Lekvold from SAFI gave an updated as to the fundraising progress that has taken place to date. As of the end of October, the hopes are to have around \$40,000.00 to go towards the project from fundraising and donations. The goal is to raise \$150,000.00 and be able to begin demolition by the end of May, 2019. Trying to get local contractors to donate time and expertise towards the project, and local businesses to supply materials at discounted rates. General consensus was to get a big picture plan and then go from there. No other committees met.

### Finance:

- On motion by Jesse Cole, and seconded by Tim Tande, the September 6, 2018 – October 3, 2018 claims in the amount of \$67,476.70 were approved unanimously as presented.
- On motion by Tim Tande and seconded by Jesse Cole, the Activities Report for September 2018 was approved unanimously as presented.

### New Business:

- Superintendent Thomas gave presentation on Indian Education For All. This meets state requirements for annual Board training in this area.
- Jesse Cole moved to hire Cale Handran as assistant boys basketball coach for the 2018-2019 winter season. Matt Stentoft seconded, with Don Hagan, Jesse Cole, Tim Tande and Matt Stentoft all voting Aye and Leif Handran abstaining, motion passed.
- Jesse Cole moved to hire the following sub-varsity coaches for the 2018-2019 winter season.

  - Assistant High School Girls Basketball – Taylor Judisch
  - Volunteer for High School Girls Basketball – Kevin Nelson
  - Jr. High Girls Basketball – Shalice Tommerup
  - Volunteer for Jr. High Girls Basketball – KC Holum

Tim Tande seconded and all present voted in favor.

- Tim Tande moved to hire Tyerra Morgan as a half time temporary paraprofessional for the 2018-2019 school year. Leif Handran seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Tim Tande moved to accept Doug States' resignation. Matt Stentoft seconded and all present voted in favor. The board wished Doug well and thanked him for his time at Scobey Schools.
- Matt Stentoft moved to include Dale Utech to the substitute list as a substitute custodian and hire Aspyn Farris and Makayla Hauk as part time custodians for the 2018-2019 school year.
- Tim Tande moved to allow the Lions to sell 50/50 tickets at the 2018-2019 home basketball games. Leif Handran seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Matt Stentoft moved to approve the updates to the Drug Testing Policy and Consent form. Leif Handran seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Jesse Cole moved to cancel warrant #118114 for \$10.16 dated December 1, 2017. Tim Tande seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Tim Tande moved to approve the first reading of Board Policy 2510 School Wellness Policy as presented. Matt Stentoft seconded and all present voted in favor.
