Dear Parents,

Reopening: The past 12 months have been unlike any other in the history of BHPCNS. This newsletter brings us full circle from when we closed our program last March to our reopening in just 5 weeks. The entire BHPCNS staff and I are so excited to be reopening our doors and returning to some semblance of normalcy on April 6<sup>th</sup>. We are expecting over 125 children and 30 staff members to be part of our Spring Term. To the families who are new to our program, we cannot wait to meet you and your children. To our returning families, we are looking forward to seeing how much you've grown. To the families maintaining their bubbles and pods, or have moved onto other programs we will miss you and hope you will come and play on the playgrounds<sup>®</sup> Reopening information is on page 4. **Summer Camp:** Camp planning is well underway. We are currently accepting camp registrations. Camp is open to all children currently enrolled in our 2s' program and ages 3 through rising 1<sup>st</sup> graders. Friends, cousins, neighbors are all welcome. Campers do not need to be currently enrolled BHPCNS students (with the exception of 2-year-olds). Current students who are not potty trained may attend camp for an additional \$75 fee. 

# Outdoor Or Indoor Drop-off & Pick Up????

In the event of bad weather an email blast/text blast will be sent with details.



**Outdoors:** BHPCNS plans to hold our school programming outdoors as much as possible. Children will be dropped off and picked up at their outdoor classroom tent each day. At drop off the children will have their temperature taken by their parent or caregiver who is dropping them off. The adult present will complete a series of questions. If the child is cleared to enter programming, they will join their classmates in the tented area.

**Indoors:** If it is pouring down rain, drop-off and pick-up with occur either at a child's classroom or in Memorial Hall. Each classroom will have a specific entry/exit point into and out of the building. Health screenings will be conducted in the hallways prior to entering the classrooms. When indoors all classroom will have open windows and doors for increased air circulation and ventilation.

Because our programming will be primarily outdoors children need to be outfitted for all kinds of weather. It's important to dress your child in layers, especially as the days become warmer. Each child should have: (links are for reference only – I am not endorsing one product over another)

- 1. Rain jacket shorter jackets are easier for a child to play in than a long rain coat
- 2. Waterproof pants or water proof overalls or rain suit
- 3. Boots- should fit well and preferably tie to stay on
- 4. Closed toe sneakers/shoes with socks
- 5. <u>Fleece jackets</u> are easier for a child to climb than a coat. Hoods are handy for colder days.
- 6. Sweat pants and/or leggings are much easier to play in than straight legged pants/jeans. Dresses should always be worn with leggings or shorts underneath.

### School Supplies

## Each child should bring to school each day:

- 1. Tote bag No backpacks. Tote bags are easier for a child to use.
- 2. Water bottle
- 3. Lunch in a soft sided lunch bag
- 4. A set of extra clothes
- 5. Extra masks

The Parents' Group will be selling BHPCNS tote and lunch bags during the first week of school. You DO NOT need to use BHPCNS bags!

#### ALL ITEMS MUST BE LABELED WITH A CHILD'S NAME!

#### SNACK AND LUNCH AT BHPCNS DURING SPRING TERM

Snacks and lunches will be eaten outdoors, as the weather allows. Children will be spaced apart and there will be no sharing of food. Should lunch be held indoors, children will be spaced throughout the classroom and will eat facing in the same direction. Full details are available in Re-Opening Protocols.



**SNACKS:** BHPCNS will provide a daily morning snack for all children and a daily afternoon snack for the children who stay for Stay and Play. A snack calendar will be published on our website.

**LUNCHES:** Parents will pack a lunch for their child. Lunches need to be in soft sided lunch bags. Please no bento boxes. Lunches are refrigerated during the morning.

Lunch at BHPCNS: Just a reminder that the State of Maryland Department of Education requires us to put out a child's lunch in its entirety. If your child has a cookie or a piece of candy in their lunch bag we are not allowed to tell them to eat their healthy foods first. If you would like your child to eat their "growing" foods first, I'd suggest saving the treat until after school. Reminder: Lunches must be in soft bags. Bento Boxes do not fit in our refrigerators. Thank you.



#### **CURRENT BHPCNS COVID-19 TRAVEL POLICY & UPDATES**



MD State Travel Emergency Order: On December 10, 2020, Gov. Larry Hogan issued an emergency order requiring Marylanders to limit all travel to essential purposes only. All Marylanders who do travel outside of Maryland or any individuals who do travel to Maryland must either obtain a negative COVID-19 test result or self-quarantine for 10 days. This applies to all states, with the exception of Delaware, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Washington, DC. Read the governor's order and the MDH health directives.

Based on the Governor's order and the latest information available, BHPCNS has implemented the following travel policy for all families and staff.

Out of State Travel: Any out of state travel, except for those states listed above, requires a Negative COVID-19 test after returning home or a 14-day quarantine to return to BHPCNS.

**Returning to BHPCNS Programming after Traveling:** After traveling and upon your return to MD, you must follow one of the 2 options listed below, before your child may return to programming.

#### **Option 1**: Your child(ren) must:

- 1. quarantine for 4 days
- 2. be tested for COVID on their 5<sup>th</sup> day home, with a PCR test
- 3. have their results shared with the school prior to returning to campus
  - a. If the results are negative, the child(ren) may return to programming.
  - b. If the results are positive, the child(ren) will not be allowed to return to programming until their doctor provides written notice the child(ren) may return to school.

#### **Option 2:** Your child(ren) must:

1. quarantine at home for 14 days.

After 14 days if your child has not experienced any symptoms of COVID-19, parents are to contact the office and you child may return to programming.

#### **Hosting Out-of-Town Guests:**

We ask if you are hosting out-of-town guests or family members visit your home, you apply the same level of caution as outlined in either Option 1 or Option 2.

#### **Staff COVID-19 Vaccinations:**

While not a requirement to return to work, all BHPCNS staff have been strongly encouraged to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. Slowly, but surely, the majority of the BHPCNS staff has been able to get vaccination appointments and are hopeful the staff will be immunized prior to the start of the Spring Term.

#### NEW – TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM BEGINNING SEPTERMBER 2021!



#### Transitional Kindergarten at BHPCNS

BHPCNS has developed a transitional program specifically geared to those children who meet the age-eligibility for Kindergarten, but would benefit from another year in a play-based, developmentally appropriate, nurturing atmosphere. Transitional kindergarten (TK) at BHPCNS is designed to give children who have already completed a Pre-K or four-year-old preschool program an additional year of preparation, providing the gift of time as they continue to grow academically, socially, and emotionally.

Transitional kindergarten students are challenged with kindergarten-level instruction in the core subjects of language arts, math, science, and social studies. They enjoy rich peer-to-peer social interactions, role playing, and group discussion centered on social skill development. During this year, independence is fostered as students master foundational concepts needed to thrive in a kindergarten classroom.

#### Benefits of Transitional Kindergarten Include:

#### **Academic Preparedness**

Increased literacy, language, and math skills as a child transitions to kindergarten

#### **Executive Function Skills**

Fostering positive behaviors such as self-control, flexibility, independence, and organization that are vital for successful learning.

#### Individual Attention

With a small class size, students benefit from one-on-one attention from teachers and staff.

#### **Successful Transitions**

Students move onto kindergarten with confidence to succeed and grow throughout their childhood and educational years.

#### Eligibility Requirements for BHPCNS' TK Program

TK is for students who are age eligible for Kindergarten (age 5 on or before September 1, 2021) and are looking for a bridge year between preschool and kindergarten.

#### MCPS Kindergarten Registration is Happening Now!

MCPS elementary schools need to know if your child will be attending their school in September. To register your child, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending in the fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall.
