From the Pastor's Desk...

"We need a little Christmas, right this very minute..." is a lyric from a popular Christmas song and this year, I couldn't agree more! We need a little (or a lot) of Christmas this year, right this very minute, right now BUT in the church, we observe the season of Advent. Advent begins 4 weeks before Christmas and is a time of preparation and hope. Time during this season is often marked with an Advent Wreath of 4 candles, one candle for each of the 4 weeks of Advent and a 5th candle to be lit on Christmas. Another way to mark time in this season is with an Advent calendar, there are many varieties of these, some designed more for children and families and in recent years, some designed for adults...the idea is to "open" the assigned window for each day during Advent, until all windows are opened and it's Christmas.

With all that has been happening in our world this year, I started seeing and hearing people talking about getting ready for Christmas earlier than usual...they were referring to listening to Christmas music and decorating earlier than they usually would. The main reason being that they needed more joy and something to look forward to with all of the challenges of this year. The idea is that the happiness they experience was something that was longed for and they figured, why wait, why not start early. I've also noticed various articles that spoke to this and in a sense, the authors, "gave permission", so that people experienced happiness not guilt.

Advent is a season I treasure, I enjoy the preparations for Christmas, I enjoy the longing and expectant tones of Advent music, the lighting of the Advent Wreath and the opening of Advent calendars, and I usually wait to decorate until after Thanksgiving but not this year. This year, I put my tree up on November 12, unusually early for me, mainly because I wanted the extra light that tree brings with its strings of lights...I have yet to place any ornaments on the tree, nor have I done any other decorating...I simply wanted the extra light in the evening and the hope that even strings of lights bring in this season. As our world continues to face new and different challenges this year and as some traditions and gatherings may look and feel very different this year, hold on to the things that give you hope in this season filled with expectation and hope, even if it's strings of lights hung on a tree in the middle of November...so in this season of Advent, may you be filled with the expectation and hope that the Christ child brings, even if it looks or feels like an early Christmas this year.



Advent Preparation: The season of Advent has begun and you are invited to set up an Advent Wreath in your home in observance and celebration of this season. Each week in the Advent season, we mark time by lighting a candle as we prepare for Christ's birth. Your Advent Wreath does not need to be fancy or an established wreath, it can simply be 4 candles (matched or unmatched, tapers or tealights or pillars, flame or battery operated) with space for a 5th candle for Christmas. We hope this will be a meaningful part of our Advent observance this year.

Advent Mid-Week Worship Services: Join us for Holden Evening Prayer and Advent themes on the following 3 Wednesdays, December 2, 9, and 16. Light your Advent candle/s and take some time in the middle of the week for evening worship. These recorded worship services will be posted by Wednesday afternoon on our regular online platforms.

Advent Wreath Readers: Looking for volunteers to read a brief prepared reading for the Advent Wreath Lighting portion of a couple of our upcoming recorded worship services. You can record at home and send it in or you can read from the church while we record worship, whatever you're comfortable with. Looking for a reader for the December 13 and 20 worship services. Please contact Pastor Jennifer if you'd like to volunteer.

The Children's Christmas Play will be part of our recorded worship service on Sunday, December 20, it will be the Message of the day. Join our students and their families as they share the meaning and traditions of Christmas. Thank you in advance to all of our participants.

At this point, we are planning for a recorded worship service for **Christmas Eve**, Thursday, Dec. 24. In anticipation of this year's different worship experience, there are a couple of things that you can do to prepare for this service. A meaningful part of our worship tradition has been to end the Christmas Eve worship with a candlelight service while singing "Silent Night", we are still planning on ending the service in this way but you will be invited to participate from home. So have a candle ready (flame or flameless, any size candle) as you prepare for the Christmas Eve service and we will keep you updated as to any changes.
