
# Genealogy Club Saturday, May 17th 11am: Meet & Greet 12pm: Zoom Presentation

These records can provide a wealth of genealogical information not found elsewhere. 

All levels are welcome, from novice to experienced. Please RSVP by calling the main desk at 508-947-9028.





The Mass Capoeira Culture Center is a cultural organization dedicated to promoting fitness, fun, and personal development through the art of capoeira. Their performances are boisterous, dynamic, and interactive.



Typical Mass Capoeira performances include live music and singing, explanations of basic movements, acrobatic solos, and a capoeira roda, where they demonstrate the complete experience of playing capoeira in a traditional circle. Performances may also include stories about capoeira history, maculelê (a warrior dance with sticks), and other Afro-Brazilian arts and music styles.

Peaks—New Light: a collection of oil paintings by Randy Swann April 12th- May 29th

Reception with artist: Saturday, April 12th, 11:00am-1:00pm

Influenced by the natural wonders of Iceland while on a visit in early 2024, Swann painted a series of mountainous landscapes. The mountains that he saw were "sharply outlined against the sky, streaked with contrasting lines of oxidized red ochre, deep greenish umber and (an) array of dazzling blue hues that changed with the light as if through a kaleidoscope". A Lakeville resident and former Trustee of the Lakeville Public Library, multi-disciplinary artist and writer Swann describes these mountains as symbols of resilience, optimism, and hope.


