Go and Bear Fruit

Fruit trees are one of the many wonders of God's creation. To see the beauty of the tree and its fruit, to enjoy its taste, and to realize that it all came from a tiny seed is beyond our comprehension. An apple seed is planted in the ground, and, with water and sun as nourishment, miraculously a seedling surfaces that develops into a fruit tree. After a period of time, the apple tree fulfills its mission by bearing apples.

We, as Christians, are like that apple tree. We, too, have been fed and nourished by God so we can bear fruit. "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide..." (John 15:16). Jesus tells us "I am the Vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in Me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). The life and power of any plant is found in its vine. The vine uses the branches to produce its fruit. The branch is simply a growth of the vine, produced by it and appointed to bear fruit. The branch exists only because the vine makes it possible.

Fruit characterizes the life of the Christian steward. When we stay connected to Jesus, we are told that we "will bear much fruit." Christ has given us the task of ministering to the needs of others and spreading the Gospel. As we stay connected to Him through His Word and Sacraments, we discover God's perfect will for us, and we are empowered to please Him by bearing fruit (Colossians 1:9-10). God has created us to bear fruit (Ephesians 2:10), but only through Christ is it possible for us to do so.

"If we live by the Spirit," Paul exhorted, "let us also keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another" (Galatians 5:25-26). As children of God, we have this fruit because His Spirit lives in us, not as a result of our own efforts. We do cease to bear fruit when we give in to our sinful natures, becoming, in Paul's words, "Conceited, provoking one another." We are to "Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness" (Ephesians 5:11a), but are to "Walk as children of light (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord" (Ephesians 5:8b-10).

Go and bear fruit!



Where do we go from here? I'm sure you've asked yourself that question. Over the past year, we at Trinity have asked ourselves this question. First, it was clean-up, then planning, then renovation work in the church basement! But now... IT'S DONE! Hallelujah! Literally, praise the Lord! But what do we do with the renovated space?

Certainly, it will continue to be used for Sunday School and congregational gatherings. But what else? God has saved us in Christ, God has saved us and rebuilt our building for His purpose. Part of that purpose is to grow in faith through teaching and fellowship. However, our neighbors, our community has needs this space could serve.

What are those needs? Here's some possibilities for us to pray about and research.

<u>Swaddling clothes ministry</u>- We are Pro-Life. God loves babies and families. Swaddling Clothes is a ministry of the LCMS that supports women and families through diapers/baby wipes, and other birthing needs. This ministry has benefited many throughout lowa. ESL (English as a Second Language) classes- English is a hard language to learn. This program operates through Iowa District West Hispanic Missionary Rev. Pedro Lopez. Many of our neighbors want to learn English or speak it better this program helps them to do that. The Hispanic population in Hawarden is huge. They are our neighbors. How can we serve them?

What else could we do to serve our neighbor?

We are blessed to have neighbors at St. Paul's, Ireton. Pastor Boothby and I have been in conversation with Rev. Dr. Keith Haney, Missionary Executive for Iowa District West, about ways our congregations can work together. We need each other. We have each other!
