Regular Meeting ----- October 28, 1993

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, ATTENDANCE D. L. Taylor at 7:00 A.M. at the District office. Other Board members present were Bobbie Domenick, James Walker, Karl Tangren, and David Maki.

Special Service District members present were Dan Holyoak, George White, Bill McDougald and D. L. Taylor.

Others present were Nate Knight, Dale Pierson, Marsha Modine and Roberta Highland.

The chair called for additions or corrections to MINUTES the minutes of the meeting of October 14, 1993. Bobbie Domenick moved the minutes be approved as circulated. James Walker seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

Dale reported that Wilene Shumway contacted him SHUMWAY UNDERand asked if the District would sell her 10 AF of irrigation GROUND WATER water. She owns some property south of the highway and can- RIGHT LEASE not connect to our irrigation system. Mark Page has suggested the District sell, on an annual basis, or lease, a portion of our underground right that is not being used. The District has never done this before, but there is right available that has reserved for future public culinary use. She already has a well on the property and a small right. After a discussion, Dan moved to sell, on an annual basis, to Wilene Shumway 10 AF of our underground water right. Bill seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

Dale reported the State Land Board had contacted STATE LAND the District regarding the District's protest of the rate BOARD RATE increase for 1992 lease of the dam site. That protest meet- APPEAL ing will be on November 10, and members will need to attend that meeting in Salt Lake City. Dan asked that our legislative representatives from this area be asked to attend that meeting. The lease system was discussed. Purchasing the dam site was discussed, and it was stated the land cannot be sold until the General Management Plan is approved. moved to attend the meeting. James seconded. George asked if the 15 year pay off be at a quaranteed rate. Dale stated this is an appeal to the full state land board and is a final appeal. D. L. suggested Dale contact the representatives and the State Land Board member from this District and see if they can attend and what the chances are. was called:

Gary Carmichael has contacted Dale and plans to CARMICHAEL call for more water from the GCWCD system in January based REQUEST FOR on the MIC contract stating "In its selling of water for ir- IRRI. WATER rigation purposes, the Conservancy District agrees to give preference in the sale of any available irrigation water developed by the project, to the stockholders of the Company. This preference shall only apply to irrigation water available for sale, and shall not apply to municipal or industrial water." The clause in our contract which Carmichael relies on to bolster his claim reads "the District hereby agrees to sell water on a year to year basis to Water User on the following terms and conditions" However the Contract also states "This contract is in effect on a year to year basis, and will terminate ... if payment is not received by January 31st of the year in question. Upon termination of this contract, it is hereby mutually agreed that the water will be considered available for sale to other The Board agreed with Dale's interpretation that users:" all water is not "available for sale each January." Walker suggested Dale write Gary a letter stating the Board's interpretation. The Board agreed by consensus.

Nate Knight stated he is here representing the RECREATIONAL golf course. The Golf Course Board is concerned about the RATE - MOAB fact the GCWCD Board created a new water sales category, GOLF CLUB "recreational rate" just for the golf course. The original contract was discussed, and it was pointed out that the golf course started at the agricultural rate, rather than the industrial rate of \$75.00. After a discussion, Bill moved to extend the rate of \$35.00 per AF to the golf course board for five years. Dan seconded. David Maki objected, on the grounds that all customers should be treated the same way. The vote was called and the motion carried, with Dave Maki voting "no".

The Sheley Tunnel meter was discussed. Dale ex- SHELEY TUNNEL plained again about the meter, and the need for the staff METER gauge. A Parschall flume was suggested. The flume was discussed, and the difference in flow and distance from the meter to the location of a flume. D. L. suggested the cost of a catwalk be estimated before a final decision is made. Maki suggested any metal from Atlas be clean, and suggested it might not be usable. Karl suggested each load should be scanned. Bill suggested that a clearance sheet be obtained.

Bobbie moved the checks be approved. Bill CHECK APPROVAL seconded. Motion Carried.

Bill seconded. Motion Carried.
